*<u>S5M-13044</u> Kenneth Gibson: 290th Anniversary of the Birth of Robert Adam—That the Parliament recognises that 3 July 2018 will be the 290th anniversary of the birth of the renowned Scottish neoclassical architect, interior designer and furniture designer, Robert Adam; understands that Adam spent nearly five years in Italy studying architecture under masters, Charles-Louis Clérisseau and Giovanni Battista Piranesi, before establishing his own architecture firm in London where he developed the famous Adam style and the theory of movement in architecture; notes that Adam's first new-build home was Dumfries House, which was built 1750s for William Dalrymple, 5th Earl of Dumfries, which was reopened in 2008 to be used for public tours and for promoting education and employment in Ayrshire; considers that other notable works by Adam include Fort George near Inverness, the Royal Exchange in Edinburgh, as well as significant parts of Culzean Castle and Dalquharran Castle in South Ayrshire, and believes that Robert Adam's influence in the first phase of the classical revival in Scotland and England was instrumental in the development of Western architecture, both in Europe and in North America.

*<u>S5M-13043</u> Alasdair Allan: Donald Stewart Memorial Trust Award—That the Parliament congratulates Anil Thapa, a sixth year pupil at the Nicolson Institute, on winning the 2018 Donald Stewart Memorial Trust Award; recognises Anil's dedication to academic attainment and voluntary work within both his school and the community; acknowledges that he has won two medals representing Scotland at the World Shotokan Karate Championship; further acknowledges that he was selected as Lord Lieutenant's cadet of the Western Isles, an award given to an outstanding cadet from across the three cadet forces; recognises that Anil has achieved all of this having arrived in the Isle of Lewis from Nepal at the age of eight and only knowing one phrase of English; notes that the Donald Stewart Memorial Trust was established to commemorate the outstanding work of the late MP for the Western Isles, Donald Stewart, and makes an annual award to an individual fifth or sixth year pupil from any of the secondary schools in the Western Isles for outstanding achievement, and extends its best wishes to Anil as he prepares for university.
