\*S5M-13084 Richard Lochhead: Maternity Services at Dr Gray's Hospital—That the Parliament notes the reported decision by NHS Grampian to move from a consultant-led maternity unit to a midwife-led service at Dr Gray's Hospital in Elgin due to ongoing challenges in recruiting junior and trainee doctors; recognises what it understands are concerns of the local community that women with medium or high-risk pregnancies will face a lengthy round trip of up to 160 miles to Aberdeen Royal Infirmary to deliver their babies; understands that the consultant-led unit at Dr Gray's was achieved through the successful Maternity Unit for Moray (MUM) campaign in the 1980s and 1990s; commends the Keep MUM group, which is now campaigning to retain a consultant-led service at the hospital; pays tribute to the staff at Dr Gray's, who it believes have continued to deliver excellent care to mums and babies under increasing pressure due to the hospital's recruitment difficulties; acknowledges the upcoming centenary of Dr Gray's, marking 100 years of the hospital being at the heart of the community and caring for the people of Moray, and notes the view that the best way to mark the centenary is for NHS Grampian to work with the Scottish Government to secure the long-term future of the consultant-led maternity service at Dr Gray's so that women and babies in Moray can access the care that they need locally.
