***S5M-14686 Gillian Martin: Women's Business in Global Entrepreneurship Week—**That the Parliament welcomes the return of Global Entrepreneurship Week, which runs from 12 to 16 November 2018; celebrates the work of Women's Enterprise Scotland (WES) in promoting and supporting women into business; commends the contributions of women business owners and WES to the Cross Party Group on Women in Enterprise; considers that gender-blind policy making must be replaced by a gender-aware approach to economic development, enterprise and growth policies; notes that recent research by the FSB, in partnership with WES, suggests that there is a shortage of consistent and regular gender-disaggregated business ownership data; believes that the collection and analysis of such data is critical to enabling policy makers to meet the needs of

women-led businesses; understands that the research shows that, although employment in majority women-owned businesses in Scotland has increased from 153,132 (9.02%) in 2012 to 231,390 (13.26%), women's entrepreneurship remains a largely untapped source of economic potential and that, if this was fully used, it could help to boost job creation; believes that, if the rates of women-led businesses equalled those of men, the contribution to Scotland's GVA would increase from £7.6 billion to £13 billion, representing a 5.4% growth in the economy, and looks forward to the awareness week highlighting women's contribution to business across Scotland.

***S5M-14685 Annie Wells: Small Talk Saves Lives Campaign, Preventing Suicide on the Railways**—That the Parliament congratulates the Samaritans on its campaign, Small Talk Saves Lives, which it launched in 2017 and runs in partnership with the British Transport Police (BTP), Network Rail and the wider rail industry; notes that figures published on 8 November 2018 suggest that more people are helping to prevent suicide on Scotland's railways; acknowledges that, in 2017-18, members of the public and rail staff intervened 10 times to help vulnerable people, with a further five since April; believes that the initiative was developed after research showed that, along with the rail and BTP staff who are now trained by Samaritans, passengers can play a key role in suicide prevention; understands that, for every life lost on the railway, six are saved by those around them; notes therefore the campaign's message that the same small talk that people use every day can often be enough to interrupt a person's suicidal thoughts and encourage them to get help, and hopes that everyone in these circumstances will have the confidence to trust their instincts and start a conversation.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
