*S5M-14696 Stuart McMillan: Universal Credit's Impact on Food Bank Usage in

Scotland—That the Parliament notes with concern recent reports suggesting that food bank usage has risen across Scotland, particularly in local authority areas where Universal Credit (UC) is being rolled out; understands that, in Inverclyde, usage has increased by 350% since 2012, with the biggest increase rise in 2017, the year following the introduction of UC; believes that this highlights what it sees as the harsh reality of the UK Government's austerity agenda and welfare reforms; considers that these have had a disproportionate impact on people on low incomes and other vulnerable groups, such as women, disabled people and people from minority ethnic backgrounds; understands that there have been billions of pounds in cuts to social security support since the Conservative Party came to power in 2010, which have directly influenced poverty levels; believes that, at the same time, the UK Government has chosen to spend and earmark billions towards the renewal of Trident; considers that austerity is a political choice that has plunged people into crisis, and believes that it was a decision taken alongside the choice to invest heavily in nuclear weapons, while families struggle to put food on the table.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
