S5M-13271 Rachael Hamilton: Arthritis Research UK Survey on Access to Work—That the Parliament welcomes the survey by Arthritis Research UK and Arthritis Care Scotland, which has gathered information for, and raised awareness of, the Access to Work Scheme for people who live with arthritis and related musculoskeletal conditions, such as back pain; recognises that the scheme was created in 1994 as a specialist disability service giving practical advice and support to disabled people who are working, self-employed or looking for work; welcomes the news that around 36,470 people were helped by the scheme in 2015-16 across the UK; notes that, in Scotland, it is estimated that almost 1.5 million people live with a musculoskeletal condition, including in the Scottish Borders; understands that these conditions, such as arthritis and back pain, are a leading cause of sickness absence, including among the NHS workforce, which has an impact on the individual, the health service and the wider economy, if those individuals are not supported, and supports the work by Arthritis Research UK and Arthritis Care Scotland to raise awareness of the Access to Work Scheme to help all those in Scotland and the UK who could benefit from it, and looks forward to the results and findings of the survey that are due in 2018.

### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S5M-14863 Pauline McNeill: Sauchiehall Street Recovery Fund—That the Parliament understands the importance of Sauchiehall Street to Glasgow's economy and cultural heritage; believes that the aftermath of two fires at the Glasgow School of Art and Victoria's nightclub, as well as the impact of ongoing construction work of the avenues project, have created prolonged and ongoing disruption, which is likely to have long-term consequences for the area; considers that, as this disruption has led to businesses being unable to open for a number of months and made it impossible to walk from one end of the street to the other, this has endangered the future prospect of the street regaining its place as a vibrant retail, business and social destination, and notes the view that, in order to ensure that Sauchiehall Street regains its position, a recovery plan must be established and funded to address the multiple problems currently hampering the street's ability to function as before, and to support it through the process of regaining the footfall and repeat business that has been lost.

\*S5M-14856 Angela Constance: The New West Calder High, a School for the Future—That the Parliament congratulates the staff and pupils of the new West Calder High School on its official opening at a special ceremony, which was introduced by the former Prime Minister, Gordon Brown, and was hosted by the school captains; acknowledges that the event showcased pupil achievements and included celebration music and dance, with speeches from visiting guests; believes that the £32 million facility is West Lothian's single biggest investment in education; understands that it includes a £20.2 million investment from the Scottish Government as part of the Schools for the Future Programme; believes that it provides West Lothian with a future proof-positive learning hub and the ability to deliver a first-rate education experience; understands that the award-winning building is ecologically and sustainably sound and the most modern place of learning in the country, and wishes every young person who passes through it the best of success.

\*S5M-14855 Monica Lennon: The Don't Pink My Drink Campaign—That this Parliament welcomes the campaign, #DontPinkMyDrink, which was launched by Professor Carol Emslie of Glasgow Caledonian University at the eighth European Alcohol Policy Conference in Edinburgh on 20 November 2018; understands the campaign is in response to evidence of the alcohol industry increasingly targeting women through gender-specific design, packaging and advertising; believes that gendered-alcohol marketing reinforces stereotypes and risks subverting positive progress on gender equality; recognises that Alcohol Focus Scotland is calling for more public protection from alcohol advertising, including a phased removal of alcohol-related sponsorship of sports, music and cultural events, and for an independent body to regulate marketing; believes that levels of drinking in Scotland remain too high, with the Scottish Health Survey recording that more than one-in-five people drink at a level than the recommended weekly guidelines; calls on the alcohol industry to refrain from what it sees as cynical marketing tactics that link alcohol to equality and empowerment, and welcomes the commitments by the Scottish Government in its paper, Alcohol Framework 2018: Preventing Harm, which seek to change what it sees as Scotland's difficult relationship with alcohol.

\*S5M-14854 Jamie Greene: Irvine Diplomat Listed on OUTstanding LGBT List—That the Parliament congratulates Alan Gemmell OBE who was listed at 14th in the *Financial Times*' Most OUTstanding LGBT Public Sector Executives 2018; considers that Alan, who is Director of the British Council and is from Irvine, has made notable accomplishments in this role by shifting the organisation to work online and securing a £1.75 million scholarship programme for women in India to study STEM subjects, which was the first time this has been done by the British Council; notes that Alan is also the founder of fiveFilms4freedom, a 10-day LGBT film festival that promotes freedom, equality and LGBT rights, which it understands was the world's first global online LGBT film festival, and supports the view that people in Scotland should be encouraged to become involved with institutions such as the British Council.

\*S5M-14853 Ross Greer: ECHR Rules Against Turkey Detaining Selahattin Demirtas—That the Parliament notes the European Court of Human Rights' (ECHR) ruling against Turkey over its holding in prison on pre-trial detention of Selahattin Demirtas, who is a former co-chair, MP and presidential candidate of the People's Democratic Party, for what it considers has been an unjustified period of time; understands that Selahattin has been detained for almost two years and that the ECHR has ruled that there are not sufficient reasons to extend this; acknowledges this ruling within the broader context of what it sees as political repression against Kurdish politicians, journalists and activists in Turkey, including the imprisonment of many politicians, candidates, party staff and activists of the democratic opposition, and calls on Turkey to release Selahattin, and all other political prisoners, immediately.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
