\*S5M-15796 Kenneth Gibson: UK Government's Atomic Weapons Establishment in

**Chaos**—That the Parliament notes with concern reports that the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE), which is responsible for the design, manufacture and support of warheads for the UK's nuclear weapons, is in serious financial trouble; considers that Pegasus, a £623 million plan to replace a building that handles and stores enriched uranium at the AWE site at Aldermaston, has been suspended with no confirmation as to when work will restart; understands that the costs of Mensa, a new facility under construction at Burghfield to assemble and dismantle nuclear warheads, has risen from £734 million to £1.8 billion, while the opening has been delayed from 2017 to 2023; is concerned that the Office for Nuclear Regulation has, it believes, kept AWE under "enhanced" scrutiny over the last six years as it considers that the AWE Aldermaston and Burghfield sites continually rely too heavily on the use of ageing production facilities; understands that further concerns were raised in November 2018 when AWE was fined £1 million for failing to ensure the safety of its staff, and calls on the UK Government to plan an end to what it considers the waste of public funds on AWE and make progress towards a non-nuclear defence policy.

\*<u>S5M-15795</u> Adam Tomkins: The Iconic O2 ABC — That the Parliament notes that plans have been submitted to Glasgow City Council to demolish the iconic O2 ABC building, which was substantially damaged in the June 2018 fire at the Glasgow School of Art's Mackintosh building; recognises its 143-year history, dating back to 1875 when it was first known as the Diorama, before becoming the Panorama, Hubner's Ice Skating Palace, Hengler's Circus, the Waldorf Palais dance hall and the Regal and ABC cinemas in subsequent decades; acknowledges its enormous contribution to Glasgow's music industry in recent years, hosting hundreds of international and home-grown acts and, in so doing, substantially contributing to the city's economy; understands that consideration of the demolition application by the council is in the early stages and will involve consultation with Historic Environment Scotland; expresses concern for the businesses located in the same block, including City Cutz barbers, California restaurant and Campus bar, which could also be razed; encourages Glasgow's businesses and residents to robustly engage with the council as it considers the demolition plans to ensure that their voices are

adequately heard, and urges the councillors, and other stakeholders, to take account of these views before a decision regarding the future of the O2 ABC building is made.

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dismay that the number of children living in poverty in Scotland is reportedly over 230,000; understands that Citizens Advice Scotland has been advised that projects related to child poverty/benefits and income maximisation/debt will end due to the Scottish Government ending funding for the Scottish Legal Aid Board's (SLAB) programme, Making Advice Work, which provides funding to Citizens Advice Scotland to carry out early intervention work with families, many of whom are among the poorest and most vulnerable in Scotland; notes that, in West Lothian alone, this programme reportedly helped 700 families in 2018, increasing their income by a total of £2 million; understands that, across Scotland, 25 jobs will be lost as a result of this funding reduction, affecting Citizens Advice Scotland projects in West Lothian, Dalkeith, Inverness, Lochaber, Skye and Lochalsh, Penicuik, Galashiels, Peebles, East Dunbartonshire, Fife, Airdrie, Motherwell and Wishaw, North Glasgow and Argyll and Bute; calls on the Scottish Government to reverse this cut and ensure that Citizens Advice Scotland bureaux are properly funded to help people in greatest need, and believes that this decision contradicts the First Minister's stated priority to alleviate poverty and tackle inequality in Scotland.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
