Members' Business motions that have achieved cross party support

***S5M-15226 Alexander Stewart: World Hearing Day and Hearing Awareness Week 2019**—That the Parliament acknowledges World Hearing Day on 4 March 2019 and Hearing Awareness Week, which runs from 2 to 9 March 2019; notes the view that hearing access needs to be a priority if there is to be greater public involvement and participation in many varied events; accepts that noise and poor acoustics can often be a significant cause of discomfort, distress and exclusion when it comes to group activities for older age groups and people with conditions such as hearing loss, dementia and autism; considers that there are opportunities for employability schemes to emerge from initiatives that manufacture affordable noise-absorption panels, which could be installed into community venues to help tackle noise and acoustic issues, in addition to others that design and manufacture hearing enhancement devices, and commends all groups, companies and charities that work to benefit the lives of people who live with hearing loss and the stigma that can be associated with the condition.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

***S5M-15230 Willie Coffey: Congratulations to Kilmarnock FC on its 150th Anniversary**—That the Parliament congratulates Kilmarnock FC, the oldest professional football club in Scotland, on its 150th anniversary; notes that the first recorded general meeting of the club took place on 5 January 1869 in the Temperance Hotel in Kilmarnock, notified by secretary, John Wallace; recognises the many achievements of the club, which include becoming one of the first clubs to contest an official Scottish Cup match along with Renton in 1873, winning the Championship under the manager Willie Waddell in 1965 by defeating Hearts 2-0 on the last day of the season to win the league on goal average by 0.042 goals, winning the Scottish Cup in 1920 by defeating Albion Rovers 3-2 and again in 1929 by beating Rangers 2-0 and in 1997 defeating Falkirk 1-0, winning the League Cup in 2012 by beating Celtic 1-0, winning the Ayrshire Cup 42 times, recording 189 victories out of 256 meetings with local rivals, Ayr United, regularly representing Scotland in the New York International Tournament in the 1960s, qualifying for European

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competitions on nine occasions, notably defeating Eintracht Frankfurt 5-4 on aggregate in the club's first European tie in 1964 after being four goals down, welcoming Real Madrid to Rugby Park as league champions in 1965, drawing 2-2, and reaching the semi-final of the Inter Cities Fairs Cup in 1966-67 against Leeds United; recognises that the club is enjoying its 26th season in a row in the top flight in Scotland; notes that the club recorded the highest points tally of 74 points in the calendar year 2018, and sends the club, staff and supporters its best wishes for the year ahead and for many years to come.

***S5M-15229 John Mason: Oppression of Minorities in China**—That the Parliament deplores the treatment of a number of minority nationalities, faith groups and others by the Chinese Government; is particularly concerned about the plight of Tibet and Tibetans, Uighur Muslims living in Xinjiang, Christians throughout China and practitioners of Falun Gong; notes reports that “re-education camps” are said to contain between 500,000 and 2 million Uighur and other Muslim minority people, mainly men; notes with extreme concern reports of malnourishment, deaths and the forced use of drugs in these camps, with some former prisoners mentioning the use of torture; considers that the people of Scotland, including those in the Glasgow Shettleston constituency, expect their Parliament to speak out on what it considers such human rights abuses, despite the fact that China is an important trading partner, and expresses solidarity with those living in China and Tibet who find their way of life under threat.

***S5M-15237 Fulton MacGregor: Dean Ford**—That the Parliament notes with sadness the passing of Dean Ford, lead singer of the Scottish pop group, Marmalade, at the age of 72; notes that Coatbridge-born Dean co-founded the group in 1961, which went on to release 11 singles, the best known of which, a cover of The Beatles' *Ob-la-di Ob-la-da*, reached number one in 1968, allowing Marmalade to become the first Scottish band to have a UK number one hit; respectfully acknowledges this achievement, welcomes the musical legacy that Dean leaves, and sends its condolences to his family.

***S5M-15236 Richard Lyle: New Year's Honour for Elizabeth “Liz” Wilson of Uddingston**—That the Parliament congratulates Elizabeth “Liz” Wilson of Uddingston on being awarded the British Empire Medal in the New Year's Honours List for services to the community of Uddingston; understands that Liz was supported for the honour by a wide range of elected members and community activists in recognition of her years of unwavering service and commitment to Uddingston Pride; notes that Uddingston Pride has been chaired by Liz for 15 years and is an organisation aimed at improving the appearance of Uddingston by decorating its streets with attractive floral displays, and by maintaining a tidy and litter-free environment; acknowledges that, under her stewardship, the organisation has won national recognition including Keep Scotland Beautiful awards; believes that her work and that of Uddingston Pride to improve the experience of people who live in the community, giving them a sense of belonging and a pride in Uddingston, is to be commended, and sends its best wishes to Liz on her honour and to Uddingston Pride for its continuing success in the future.

***S5M-15235 Neil Findlay: Youngest-ever US Congresswoman**—That the Parliament welcomes the election of 29-year-old Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, the youngest woman ever elected to the US Congress; understands Ms Ocasio-Cortez is a member of the Democratic Socialists of America

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and worked as a waitress, educator and publisher prior to her election; notes her long-standing support for progressive politics, and wishes her every success in pursuing progressive policies during her term of office.

***S5M-15234 Stuart McMillan: Heather Dougan and Ellie-Jayne Fabiani Win Gold at Aerial Hoop World Championships**—That the Parliament congratulates the aerial gymnasts, Heather Dougan, 11, and Ellie-Jayne Fabiani, 9, from Inverclyde, on winning gold on their debut at the World Championships in Italy; notes that the girls won gold for a doubles routine in the Children's Duo category and that Ellie-Jayne won gold for her solo routine in her age group; recognises that this is a big achievement for Heather and Ellie as they have only been training for a year, and wishes them all the best for future competitions.

***S5M-15233 Stuart McMillan: Kathleen McMillan Named RSPB Young Nature Champion**—That the Parliament commends Kathleen McMillan on being named RSPB Young Nature Champion at the Nature of Scotland Awards; notes that the dedicated Greenock conservationist volunteers at the Greenock Cut Visitor Centre, has worked tirelessly to promote wildlife and conservation for future generations as a former ranger at the Clyde Muirshiel Regional Park, and is the current chair of the Greenock Cut Volunteer Group; appreciates that the 26-year-old also organises local beach cleans; understands that the former Ardgowan Primary and Greenock Academy pupil received her special award, which was made out of a tree stump, at the Sheraton Grand Hotel in Edinburgh, and thanks Kathleen for her conservation efforts.

***S5M-15232 Stuart McMillan: Taylor Burns Organises Free Christmas Dinner for 70 People**—That the Parliament commends Taylor Burns for organising a free festive dinner to bring lonely people together for Christmas in Greenock for a second year running; notes that the 21-year-old fed 70 people at Gibshill Community Centre thanks to her team of hardworking volunteers, including the TV star, Hardeep Singh Kohli, who was head chef on the day; recognises that everyone received a present as well as their three-course Christmas dinner, and that Taylor and her team gave up their time on Christmas Eve to prepare for the day; understands that guests ranged in age from a one-year-old to a senior citizen of 82, with the majority of diners being elderly, many of whom were widowed; appreciates that, after the meal, everyone enjoyed a disco, and that entertainment was provided by the Greenock singer-songwriter, Anthony McElwee, and vocalist and songwriter, Jud Harron, and thanks Taylor, the volunteers involved, and the local businesses who supported the event.

***S5M-15231 John Mason: France to Overtake UK in Economic League**—That the Parliament notes the release of the report, *World Economic League Table*, by the Centre for Economics and Business Research, which shows that France is likely to overtake the UK as the sixth largest economy in the world in 2019; understands that the report states that “disruption” caused by Brexit was inevitable and would lead to a damaging drop in both inward and business investment; considers that this clearly underlines that the UK is not a force for economic stability, and believes that an independent Scotland could do much better than what it considers the rampant economic self-harm being carried out by successive UK governments.

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***S5M-15227 Neil Findlay: Kaiam Europe and Kaiam UK**—That the Parliament expresses its deep regret at the conduct of Kaiam Europe and Kaiam UK in failing to pay the wages owed to its staff at Livingston leaving them without money in the run up to Christmas and without jobs after the New Year; believes that the company has acted appallingly and has shown complete disregard for its workforce; understands that the company notified Scottish Enterprise on 16 November 2018 and that it, in turn, notified the Scottish Government on 22 November, but that no indication of any problems with cash flow or wage payments were relayed to workers, leaving them in the lurch on Christmas Eve, and calls on the Economy, Jobs and Fair Work Committee to hold an inquiry into how companies are awarded and held accountable for public money that they receive in the form of grants and loans, and the role of the Scottish Government in this and other closures.

***S5M-15224 Alexander Stewart: Two Awards for Tullibody Community Development Trust**—That the Parliament welcomes the news that the Tullibody Community Development Trust is to receive £5,000 from the Gannett Foundation, which is the charitable arm of the *Alloa Advertiser* newspaper's parent company, Newsquest; believes that volunteers will use the money to create a new social space for residents, complete with a kitchen and café at the Tullibody Civic Centre; notes that the group is hoping to be able to open the facility up to parents before and after dropping their children off at school or nursery; notes that the trust also announced that it had been successful in receiving further funding from a separate grant bid, receiving £2,000 from the Tabhair Charitable Trust; notes that this will be used to cover the cost of installing and running its broadband and wi-fi for one year, its card payment and security systems, as well as purchasing cleaning supplies; thanks both charitable trusts for their magnanimous awards, and wishes everyone involved all the very best in their endeavours.
