\*<u>S5M-17871</u> Daniel Johnson: Citizens' Assemblies and Citizens' Juries—That the Parliament recognises what it sees as the potential of citizens' assemblies and citizens' juries as means of facilitating greater public engagement in the legislative process; considers that inclusive policy making can be beneficial in resolving challenging public policy problems; believes that these include issues of existential importance to everyone on the planet, such as tackling climate change; welcomes the Parliament hosting its first citizens' assembly in March 2019, and applauds the development of innovative approaches to increasing interest and participation across Scotland in the political process, including in the Edinburgh Southern constituency.

such as the central belt and the Borders; further understands that women are more likely to be affected than men and that a woman in Orkney has a 1-in-50 chance of being diagnosed with MS compared with a man from the Borders who has a 1-in-600 chance; pays tribute to organisations across Scotland, including MS Society Orkney, which provide invaluable care and support to help those with MS to manage the condition and to live as comfortable a life as possible; acknowledges that further studies are needed to identify why some regions are at a higher risk of developing MS than others and to understand what other factors contribute to someone's likelihood of being diagnosed with MS, and calls for more funding into continued research to find this information and to provide even greater treatment for those who are living with MS, with the overarching aim being to end for good this debilitating condition.

#### Health boards: duty to work with community transport bodies

- (1) In providing non-emergency patient transport services, each health board (or, as the case may be, health and social care partnership) must work with bodies which provide community transport services in its area.
- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires a body which provides community transport services in its area to undertake work for which it does not have the capacity.
- (3) As soon as reasonably practicable after the end of each financial year, each health board or partnership must publish a report setting out—
  - (a) the steps it has taken to comply with the duty in subsection (1),
  - (b) its position on the extent to which non-emergency patient transport services in its area have been—
    - (i) effective, and
    - (ii) cost effective,
  - (c) any further action it proposes to take to comply with the duty in subsection (1).
- (4) A report under subsection (3) may be published in such manner as the board or partnership considers appropriate.
- (5) In this section, "community transport services" is to be construed in accordance with section 22(1) of the Transport Act 1985, with such modifications as the Scottish Ministers may specify for community transport services that are not bus services.>

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
