*S5M-16102 Emma Harper: Dumfries and Galloway Council United in Support of EU Citizens—That the Parliament congratulates Dumfries and Galloway Council on agreeing, at a meeting of the full council and with cross party support, a motion that it considers states unequivocally to EU citizens that they are welcome in the local authority, and that the council wants them to stay; shares what it considers the council's concerns over the potential impact of Brexit on the cultural, social and economic wellbeing of the region; understands that the motion expresses particular concern regarding the UK Government's £30,000 cap on tier 2 visas, and the impact that such a cap could have on the recruitment of vital roles such as carers, teachers, agricultural and domestic workers, areas in which the region has challenges recruiting; emphasises what it sees as the concerns of people across Scotland regarding the Brexit date being only days away and, it considers, the UK Government being no closer to achieving a deal with the EU, and congratulates the Scottish Government for what it sees as its work to protect Scotland from the harmful impacts of Brexit to every sector of society and the economy.

*S5M-16101 Gail Ross: Stonewall School Survey—That the Parliament congratulates The Highland Council on being named one of the best councils in the UK for celebrating difference in its schools and for tackling anti-LGBT bullying; notes that the UK-wide education equality index, compiled by Stonewall, has ranked The Highland Council at number eight; further notes that the Stonewall 2017 school report found that 45% of LGBT pupils are bullied at school, including 64% of trans students, and commends the ongoing work of Stonewall and The Highland Council in tackling these issues.

*S5M-16100 Elaine Smith: St Patrick's Day Festival—That the Parliament welcomes the 2019 St Patrick's Day Festival in Coatbridge, which runs from 2 to 17 March; acknowledges the large Irish diaspora in the town; understands that a number of events will take place throughout the festival, including Gaelic football, a film night, quizzes, a dinner dance, lectures and Irish music; notes that the festival concludes with a Family Street Festival on 16 March; considers that the festival brings economic, social and cultural benefits to the town, with around 15,000 people visiting every year; congratulates the organising committee, which it considers does an excellent

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job each year in bringing all events together, and wishes everyone involved success with the celebrations.

*S5M-16099 Rona Mackay: Thanks to the Enterprise Club at Killermont Primary School in Bearsden—That the Parliament thanks the P5 and P6 Enterprise Club at Killermont Primary School in Bearsden for raising £330 to help give Glasgow children in need a hot meal; notes that the Enterprise Club created a school calendar and that proceeds were donated to the social enterprise company, Launch Foods, which works to take surplus food from manufacturers to provide children across Glasgow with hot meals; acknowledges that the Enterprise Club launched an art contest for the whole school and chose winning artwork for each month of the calendar, and commends the Enterprise Club for choosing to do something charitable with the profits.

*S5M-16098 John Mason: Food Allergies—That the Parliament notes the BBC article, *Why the world is becoming more allergic to food*, by Dr Santos of King's College London, which draws attention to the increasing prevalence of food allergies in the UK; further notes that the UK Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs is currently seeking views on changing the food allergen information laws for food pre-packed on the premises where it is sold; considers that option 4, "label food with name of food, full ingredients list and with allergens emphasised", is the only viable option to ensure the safety of consumers; believes that it is misleading to state that all other pre-packed food currently contains "full ingredients lists", while unspecified individual ingredients can be legally listed as flavourings, starch and dextrose, among other inaccessibly named ingredients; agrees that all members of society should be able to consume food at any location, without fear of an allergic reaction from unidentified ingredients, and calls on the Scottish Government to urge the UK Government to ensure that all individual ingredients are listed on all food items, as it considers that this is the only way to minimise the struggles that those with food allergies experience daily and prevent further unnecessary deaths.

- (1) The Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995 is amended as follows.
- (2) After section 226A, there is inserted—

"226AA Declaration of income form

- (1) The court may, for the purpose mentioned in subsection (2), make an order requiring a person who has received a relevant penalty to complete a declaration of income form.
- (2) The purpose of a declaration of income form is to obtain information on the financial means of a person who has received but not paid a relevant penalty.
- (3) For the purposes of this section, a declaration of income form is a form issued by or on behalf of the court to a person who has received a relevant penalty which requires that person to provide in writing—
 - (a) the person's name,
 - (b) the person's date of birth,
 - (c) the person's home address and telephone number,
 - (d) information about the person's income,

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- (e) information about the person's expenditure,
- (f) information about the person's accommodation and living circumstances,
- (g) information about any vehicles owned by the person,
- (h) the person's bank details,
- (i) any other information as the court may specify on the form.
- (4) It is an offence—
 - (a) knowingly to provide false information on a declaration of income form,
 - (b) not to comply with an order made under subsection (1).
- (5) A person guilty of an offence under subsection (4) is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.
- (6) For the avoidance of doubt, reference in subsection (3) to "a form issued by or on behalf of the court" includes a declaration of income form issued by—
 - (a) a FEO,
 - (b) the clerk of court,
 - (c) the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service.
- (7) The Scottish Ministers may by regulations make further provision for the purposes of and in connection with this section.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
