**S5M-15513** Annabelle Ewing: Settled Status Scheme for EU Citizens in Scotland—That the Parliament notes the UK Government's decision to abandon its plans to charge EU citizens a fee when applying for their right to remain in Scotland through the EU Settlement Scheme; believes that it was wrong for the UK Government to oblige EU citizens who have built their lives in Scotland, and who contribute to the economy and communities, to pay for the status and rights they already have; acknowledges the persistence of the Scottish National Party, Scottish Labour, Scottish Green Party and the Scottish Liberal Democrats in their respective campaigns to abolish the settled status fee; considers that it remains unfair to oblige EU citizens in Scotland to apply to retain the rights that they already hold, regardless of the fee; recognises what it considers the significant economic, social and cultural contributions made by EU citizens in communities across Scotland, including in the Cowdenbeath constituency, and notes the calls on the UK Government to scrap the settlement scheme for EU citizens.

\*<u>S5M-16179</u> David Torrance: Scottish War Blinded—That the Parliament commends Scottish War Blinded for expanding its work to help veterans to the Kirkcaldy area; understands that twothirds of its members say that their sight loss had resulted in them experiencing loneliness; notes that the charity provides tailored one-on-one support and rehabilitation as well as a monthly lunch group to help overcome social isolation, and acknowledges the continued efforts of its outreach worker, Stephen Greig, to help veterans in Kirkcaldy.

#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*<u>S5M-16172</u> Maurice Golden: Increased Measures to Tackle Littering Across Scotland—That the Parliament regards littering as both an anti-social and environmental problem that adversely affects communities and the environment; notes research from Keep Scotland Beautiful, which it considers shows local environmental quality at its lowest point for a decade; further notes the £53 million annual cost to tackle littering and notes calls for renewed action to reduce these negative impacts; believes that fixed penalty notices play an important role in discouraging littering while complementing other anti-littering strategies, such as education programmes for those acting irresponsibly, and the work of local volunteer groups, such as the Save Broom Park group in East Renfrewshire and the Pals of the Privies in Paisley, which both work to keep their local communities free from litter, and notes calls for an increase in the default fixed penalty notice tariff from £80 to £100, which it believes many consider will reinforce efforts to ensure that littering is a socially unacceptable practice.

\*<u>S5M-16204</u> Gordon MacDonald: Heriot-Watt University's Graduate Apprenticeships—That the Parliament welcomes what it sees as the continued success of the Graduate Apprenticeship

scheme at Heriot-Watt University; understands that 205 fully-funded places have been awarded to the university for the 2019-20 academic year, making it one of the largest providers of graduate apprenticeships for the third year running; notes that students spend 80% of their time with employers, gaining hands-on practical experience to complement their studies; believes that the scheme continues to build on the university's commitment to help meet the needs of local and national employers that are seeking to upskill their workforce or take on talented school leavers, and wishes the graduate apprentices continued success.

\*<u>S5M-16203</u> Shona Robison: Banning of Rape Video Game—That the Parliament condemns outright the video game, *Rape Day*, which is a PC game planned to be released through the online gaming distribution platform, Steam; understands that the game's developer advertises that the game lets gamers "verbally harass, kill and rape women"; denounces this incredibly offensive game that it considers depicts, glorifies and normalises the violent sexual assault and murder of women; understands that the Video Standards Council is limited in its actions due to the current legislation under which it operates, namely the Video Recordings Act 1984, which it understands only applies to physical, boxed products, with games distributed online not being captured under the legislation; demands, therefore, that Valve bans the release of this game on its platform, Steam, and that other online platforms ban the game as well, and encourages the UK Government to review and strengthen legislation in this area.

\*<u>S5M-16202</u> Jackie Baillie: Robert the Bruce Immortalised in West Dunbartonshire—That the Parliament congratulates the *Lennox Herald* on launching a campaign to ensure that the legendary Scot, Robert the Bruce, is immortalised in West Dunbartonshire; notes that Dumbarton, the ancient capital of Strathclyde, is an area of historical significance for Robert the Bruce; understands that his story has been brought back into the public interest following the success of the Netflix film, *Outlaw King*; believes that immortalising Robert the Bruce in Dumbarton will help to develop the area's tourism potential; recognises the efforts of Historic Environment Scotland, West Dunbartonshire Council and the Friends of Dumbarton Castle in promoting tourism in the area; believes that even more can be done; commends the *Lennox Herald* for its campaign, and wishes all involved the very best in their endeavours.

\*<u>S5M-16201</u> Neil Findlay: Blacklist Campaigners Vindicated After 10 Years—That the Parliament notes that an internal police investigation, the Creedon report, has been made public; understands that this has concluded that the police, including Special Branch, and the security services, supplied information to the blacklist that was funded by some of the country's major construction firms; believes that this blacklist destroyed lives, families and reputations for decades, without justice or accountability for those affected; commends the campaigners who have resisted what it sees as this historic injustice for decades; understands that many were subject to alleged police surveillance, despite not breaking any laws; acknowledges that the findings of the report were published on 6 March 2019, which is the 10th anniversary of the day that the original details of the blacklist were exposed, and considers that this marks a historic progression in the battle against what it sees as a sustained attack on political freedom.
