<u>S5M-18420</u> Monica Lennon: Scotland's Drug Death Public Health Emergency—That the Parliament considers problem drug use across Scotland, including in the Central Scotland region, to be a national crisis; is saddened and concerned at reports that 1,187 people lost their lives due to drug-related causes in 2018, which it understands is the highest level ever reported; further understands that the rate of drug-related deaths in Scotland is the highest in the UK and across the EU; believes that every life claimed by drug misuse is a preventable tragedy, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to legally designate the crisis a public health emergency and to urgently direct councils, integration authorities, Police Scotland, NHS boards, the Scottish Ambulance Service and all other relevant public bodies to assess, prevent and address the consequences of the emergency, by working together to save lives and reduce drug-related harm.

\*S5M-18838 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Scotland's Coastal Rubbish Aerial Photography—That the Parliament recognises the SCRAPbook (Scotland's Coastal Rubbish Aerial Photography) project, which uses light air craft to fly over coast lines and take photographs of the landscape; understands that the project, which was launched by the Moray Firth Partnership and developed into a national collaboration with Sky Watch Civil Air Patrol, is highly important in tackling the masses of plastic that have built up along many of Scotland's beautiful coast lines; commends the project for the amount of data that it has accumulated, including what type of litter is the most common and which areas have some of the most build-up of litter; considers that, although this is a great step towards the goal to clear up beaches and make Scotland a cleaner, less polluted place, it is important that this information is acted; believes that people can contribute by participating in beach clean-ups, which have been taking place across Scotland, such as on Cramond Beach, and thanks all individuals, communities and organisations that have participated in beach cleans and other initiatives to reduce marine litter.

\*S5M-18837 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Cigarette Pollution—That the Parliament believes that more must be done to counter what it sees as the vast amount of polluting waste caused by cigarettes; understands that their filters are made of a plastic that takes years to decompose, releases harmful toxins into the environment and can be swallowed by marine life that mistake them for food; recognises that cigarette butts are one of the most commonly found forms of single-use plastic that wash up on shores; considers that, unlike many other common single-use plastics, there has been minimal incentives to reduce their consumption, and believes that action should be taken to find an alternative to these filters to reduce their harmful impact on the environment.

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
