40,000 deaths are attributable to exposure to air pollution across the UK each year and that children are particularly at risk from polluted air; is concerned that the report's authors found high levels of carbon dioxide present inside classrooms, which can contribute to headaches, dizziness and the inability to concentrate; understands that the World Health Organization has warned that no level of air pollution can be considered safe; believes that children must be protected from harmful emissions that can affect their heart, brain and nervous system development; considers that initiatives such as the closure of streets outside schools to motor vehicles during drop-off and pick-up times and developing a network of walking and cycling routes to schools could significantly reduce air pollution levels and improve child health, and calls on the Scottish Government to work with local authorities to ensure that adequate data monitoring and all appropriate support is in place to assist in the roll out of low-emission zones across the country.

\*S5M-19019 Pauline McNeill: HIV Outbreak in Glasgow—That the Parliament is greatly concerned at reports that Glasgow has seen the UK's worst outbreak of HIV in 30 years and that the city's health workers have said that the problem is still getting worse, with homeless people and drug users the groups most affected; believes that researchers report that a key factor enabling the virus to spread so quickly is homelessness combined with a significant rise in the numbers of people injecting cocaine, as well as heroin; commends the work of specialist street teams, such as Waverley Care, which offer rapid HIV testing to people who are not engaged with health services who inject drugs, and calls on the UK Government to consider allowing the opening of safe injecting facilities.

\*S5M-19017 Alex Cole-Hamilton: Bi Visibility Day—That the Parliament recognises that 23 September 2019 mark Bi Visibility Day, which is also known as both Celebrate Bisexuality Day and Bisexual Pride Day; understands that this awareness day, which has been celebrated around the world since 1999, promotes awareness and understanding of bisexuality, provides a platform for bisexual people and their supporters and aims to bring attention to the social, economic and cultural challenges that they can face; notes that the first UK-wide report focusing on the experiences of bisexual people, which was published in May 2015 by the Equality Network, found that 48% of respondents had received biphobic comments and that 61% had experienced multiple discrimination; condemns such comments and discrimination, and hopes that Bi Visibility Day continues to be successful in promoting awareness, understanding, equality and diversity.

#### **Proposals for Members' Bills**

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
