***S5M-19123 Rona Mackay: 25th Anniversary of the FAIRTRADE Mark**—That the Parliament notes the 25th anniversary of the launch of the FAIRTRADE Mark in the UK, which began a seismic shift in the way that people consider the labour behind the food, drink and clothing they buy; understands that more than 1.6 million farmers and workers in over 1,200 organisations around the world are part of the Fairtrade scheme, which protects them from volatile prices for their produce and supports access to education and clean drinking water for adults and their families to the benefit of whole communities; believes that the FAIRTRADE Mark is now attributed to around 5,000 products on sale in the UK and that awareness of Fairtrade certification is at a record high and trusted by 84% of consumers; acknowledges that Scotland has been a Fairtrade nation since May 2014 with all six major cities having gained Fairtrade status, and that East Dunbartonshire recently celebrated its 10th anniversary of being named a Fairtrade Zone, and notes that, with over 80% of Scotland's local authorities having achieved this status, there are calls to continue to support and promote the values of the FAIRTRADE Mark and the vital stability and improvements in conditions that it provides to farmers in developing countries to reverse the cycle of poverty enforced by low prices for their work and products.

***S5M-19155 Neil Findlay: ScotRail and Car Parking at Uphall Railway Station**—That the Parliament understands that, for three years, ScotRail has stated that it is committed to, and has plans for, upgrading parking at Uphall railway station; further understands that commitments were given to the local community to increase capacity with more parking bays to help alleviate what it considers the appalling congestion in nearby streets; acknowledges that site meetings have taken place with plans drawn up for new spaces; understands, however, that these proposals have been rejected and that there is no longer any project to increase capacity at Uphall; believes this to be a disgraceful way to operate, and considers that ScotRail has misled the community and the travelling public.

UK Withdrawal from the European Union (Legal Continuity) (Scotland) Bill (G)

Passed, 21 March 2018

Following a reference under section 33 of the Scotland Act 1998 by the Attorney General and the Advocate General for Scotland, the Supreme Court has ruled that some provisions of the Bill are outwith the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament. The Bill cannot be submitted for Royal Assent in its unamended form.
