\*<u>S5M-21499</u> Mark McDonald: The Indefinite Right to Remain for All Foreign National Key Workers and Their Families—That the Parliament calls on the UK Government to improve on its proposed one-year visa extension for all foreign national key workers; considers that this visa extension does not go far enough, but instead offers only another year of uncertainty for key workers and their families; believes that all industries working on the front line of the fight against COVID-19 are reliant on the contribution of foreign national key workers; considers that this is particularly clear in relation to the NHS; recognises that the work of foreign national key workers is vital to the safety and protection of Scotland; believes that, without their continued hard work, the journey to Scotland's recovery following the COVID-19 outbreak will be much more difficult, and encourages the UK Government to offer instead the indefinite right to remain to all foreign national key workers and their families, minimising uncertainty for all should the worst happen.

\*<u>S5M-21498</u> Neil Findlay: Follow the Danish Example on Tax Avoidance—That the Parliament urges the Scottish Government to follow the example of its Danish counterpart and ensure that companies that pay out dividends, buy back shares or are registered in tax havens will not be eligible for any government-controlled COVID-19 business support programmes, and urges the Scottish Ministers to lobby the UK Government to ensure that the same approach is applied to UK-wide initiatives.

\*<u>S5M-21497</u> Clare Adamson: Motherwell FC Community Trust—That the Parliament commends the work of Motherwell FC Community Trust on its ongoing Community Support Project, which distributes food parcels to those struggling to provide for their families in these unprecedented times, and thanks the 57 volunteers who have joined forces with the Trust for their dedication to helping maintain community spirit during the COVID-19 pandemic.

\*S5M-21495 Emma Harper: Fly-tipping in Scotland — That the Parliament expresses concern regarding a reported increase in levels of fly-tipping across communities in Scotland since restrictions have been put in place in order to limit the spread of COVID-19; understands that Scottish local authorities, including Dumfries and Galloway Council, over the last five weeks, have reported an increase in the illegal dumping of unwanted items and rubbish on farmland, in outdoor spaces, in parks and on local authority property; notes that the reports of items dumped include, but are not exclusive to, ripped-out house interiors and appliances, oil containers, gas cylinders, bin bags full of rotting food and also discarded gloves, masks of different forms and single-use plastics: recognises the comments of COSLA, the body that represents Scottish local authorities, that "Unfortunately, we are aware of an increase in fly-tipping reports in some areas, but having to deal with this takes resources away from essential and life-saving frontline services."; notes that fly-tipping in Scotland is a criminal offence and that those who are caught can be fined up to £200 and can receive a criminal conviction, but believes that only one in every 3,000 people who commit the offence are prosecuted; calls on the public to be responsible when disposing of their waste, not to fly-tip or dispose of waste inappropriately, and to contact their local authority should they have any questions or concerns about waste collections or the disposal of other waste while many council-run recycling centres are closed; thanks communities across Scotland for all they are doing during this challenging time, and repeats the Scottish Government's advice to stay at home where possible, protect the NHS and save lives.
