of Beirut on 4 August 2020; understands that the disaster was preceded by a large fire at the Port of Beirut, on the city's northern Mediterranean coast, and that shortly after 6.00pm local time, the roof of the warehouse caught alight and there was a large initial explosion, followed by a series of smaller ones before a colossal explosion that sent a mushroom cloud into the air and a supersonic blast wave radiating through the city; notes that the blast wave, believed to be caused by 2,750 tonnes of ammonium nitrate stored unsafely at a warehouse in the port, levelled buildings nearby and caused extensive damage over much of the rest of the capital, meaning that as many as 300,000 people have been made temporarily homeless and that collective losses might reach as high as £8 to £11 billion; recognises that more than 200 people are believed to have been killed by the devastating explosion, and around 5,000 injured, with the count tragically still rising, and urges the Scottish and UK governments and the wider international community to offer direct aid to the stricken country.

*<u>S5M-22395</u> Elaine Smith: 60th Anniversary of the Federation of Cuban Women—That the Parliament congratulates the Federation of Cuban Women (FMC) on its 60th anniversary; notes that it was founded after the revolution to advance women's rights, gender equality and reproductive health rights, aiming to incorporate women into the work force and to promote their participation in the process of social and economic change; acknowledges that this was achieved by increased educational opportunities and employment; recognises that Article 44 of the Cuban Constitution, drafted in 1976, states that "The state guarantees women the same opportunities and possibilities as men in order to achieve women's full participation in the development of the country"; applauds the achievements of the FMC for the invaluable work done by thousands of social and health workers in assisting women in particular who have to deal with the shortages and difficulties that have resulted from the 58-year-old US blockade and in the continued incorporation of women's issues into national politics; notes that the organisation is not financed by the Cuban Government, which it understands has the second highest number of women MPs in the world, at 53%, and sends solidarity messages to Cuban women from all backgrounds whose membership of the FMC makes it of one the largest women's organisations in the world.
