*S5M-22402 Keith Brown: Citizens Advice Scotland's Mind the Fuel Poverty Gap Report—

That the Parliament welcomes Citizens Advice Scotland's report, *Mind the Fuel Poverty Gap: Warm Home Discount in the Scottish context*, which was published on 11 August 2020 and which investigates the impact of the UK Government's Warm Home Discount on fuel poverty; notes with concern that the report finds that the initiative is failing to help significant numbers of people in Scotland who are in fuel poverty; understands that, although an estimated 29 to 32% of Scottish households are eligible for the Warm Home Discount, only 9.3% currently claim it; notes that the report finds that "no certainty is provided by the current application and administrative processes" and that those most impacted by this lack of support are working age and pensioner households; considers that the UK Government social security system is widely criticised as being designed to make accessing support difficult and to punish those who do receive help; believes that this report further strengthens the case for the Scottish Parliament to have full powers over social security, and looks forward to the Scottish Government's fuel poverty policies going live in the next year.

*S5M-22401 Alasdair Allan: New Gaelic Worship Resource from the Church of Scotland—

That the Parliament welcomes the Church of Scotland's new guide to Gaelic worship and Bible study; understands that the resource is designed as a general guide for those less confident in Gaelic language registers that are commonly associated with formal worship; notes that formal church registers in Gaelic differ from vernacular language in grammar and syntax and has proven challenging to both native speakers and language learners; further notes that the guide was produced by the Church of Scotland's Gaelic Language Development Officer, who started in post in 2019, and hopes that the guide will achieve its aim of encouraging more people to engage with worship through Gaelic.

*S5M-22400 Fulton MacGregor: Victim Support Scotland's 35th Anniversary—That the Parliament congratulates Victim Support Scotland on its 35th anniversary, having been formed on 23 August 1985; understands that it was established by a group of volunteers in Coatbridge who recognised a need to support people affected by crime in the local community; notes that the organisation has gone from strength to strength in this time with community-based services in every local authority area providing practical, financial, emotional and mental support, as well as having court-based witness services in every Sheriff and High Court in Scotland as well as some Justice of the Peace courts; further notes that the charity also provides third party reporting services for anyone who does not feel comfortable reporting a crime to the police directly; understands that Victim Support Scotland continues to invest in technology and training to ensure that it can adapt to the changing nature of crime and meet the needs of victims; recognises the outstanding commitment of its staff and volunteers over the last 35 years to support victims, witnesses and people affected by crime across Scotland; believes that this work is vital to ensuring that victims and witnesses are able to access the support services they need and the rights they are entitled to under the Victim's Code for Scotland, and wishes Victim Support Scotland all the best for the next 35 years and beyond.

*S5M-22399 John Finnie: UNESCO Heritage Site Hebron—That the Parliament notes that, in 2017, UNESCO recognised the old city of Hebron in the West Bank as a Palestinian world heritage site; acknowledges that the designation includes a holy site, known to Muslims as the Ibrahimi Mosque, and to Jews as the Tomb of the Patriarchs; supports the Chairman of Jerusalem's Committee in the Palestinian Legislative Council's condemnation of Israel's reported expropriation of part of Al-Ibrahimi Mosque, which it understands took away the Palestinian Authority's municipality of Hebron from its supervision over the Mosque; further supports his reported view that handing control of the Mosque to the Settlement Planning Council "is a new crime"; shares concerns at reports that this measure aims to expropriate the lands of the Mosque to build new Jewish settlement projects; considers the Israeli actions to be a violation of right to ownership of Al-Ibrahim and the other endowments around it; condemns the Israeli court's reported dismissal of a petition filed by Hebron municipality requesting that it cancel the previous permission it had granted for the Settlement Planning Council to install an elevator inside Al-Ibrahimi Mosque; shares fears that the cumulative effect of such acts, and what it sees as an Israeli assertion of sovereignty, would be de facto annexation; hopes that this site, like all other UNESCO heritage sites, can be a place for peaceful coexistence, and calls on all parties to adhere to international law and humanitarian norms.
