#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*<u>S5M-20785</u> Miles Briggs: NRAC Funding Parity, NHS Lothian—That the Parliament notes that NHS Lothian has had its busiest year on record for hospitals and community health centres; understands that the health board provided care and treatment to more patients in 2019 than ever before, with a total of 1,693,614 attendances, admissions and appointments throughout acute and community services, an increase of nearly 3% on the previous year, with general practices carrying out around 5 million urgent and routine appointments across Lothian; acknowledges the hard work of all staff in NHS Lothian, who it considers do an exceptional job in what can be very challenging circumstances; understands that Edinburgh and the Lothians have the fastest growing populations in Scotland, and acknowledges the view that NHS Lothian should receive funding parity with other health boards, so that it is in a position where it has the resources needed to take forward long-term sustainable improvements to services.

#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*<u>S5M-20784</u> Neil Findlay: West Lothian Council Childcare—That the Parliament welcomes the progress that West Lothian Council is making to ensure that every eligible child in West Lothian receives 1,140 hours of free high-quality early years childcare; understands that West Lothian is on track to have facilities and staff in place to provide increased hours and flexibility in all council-run early learning and childcare establishments, and believes that this is a positive step from the council to help ease the pressures of childcare.

#### \*S5M-20782 John Mason: Good Governance Over Equal Pay Settlement—That the

Parliament understands that the Accounts Commission has concluded that Glasgow City Council has shown good governance planning in its delivery of the project to finance £500 million in equal pay claims on behalf of women who were historically discriminated against in terms of their pay; believes that it has taken an SNP-led council to deliver the equal pay settlement, and recognises the importance of parity of pay for men and women doing jobs of equivalent value across the country and across sectors.

\*<u>S5M-20781</u> Maureen Watt: Bowel Screening Uptake in the North East—That the Parliament welcomes encouraging statistics released by Information Services Division (ISD) showing that more people in north east Scotland are taking part in bowel screening tests compared to the national average; understands that, compared with the national average of 61.1%, the average uptake for bowel screening in NHS Grampian is 67.1%; notes that, in the health board area, 64.3% of eligible men and 69.9% of eligible women were screened, with a total of 191,698 eligible people screened in Grampian up to 30 April 2019; recognises that bowel cancer is the third most commonly-occurring cancer in Scotland, and the second most common cause of death from the disease, and urges all eligible people to participate in a test to ensure early detection and treatment as soon as possible.
