*S5M-20972 John Mason: Points-based Immigration System—That the Parliament notes with dismay the points-based immigration system that the UK Government has proposed; challenges the notion that the 8.5 million economically inactive people in the UK could or should be put to work, given that this group includes disabled people, and considers this an attack on people's right to social security; believes that the 70 points required would be a barrier to many people who could offer skills and employment to the benefit of the Scottish economy; understands that, under the current proposal, the UK Government has created some flexibility around jobs in occupations that are deemed to have a shortage, but questions whether the UK Government understands the needs of the Scottish economy and whether it would relax immigration visas for those seeking work in a sector in Scotland that is experiencing a shortage where no such shortage exists at the UK level, and calls on the UK Government to devolve immigration powers to Scotland so that the Scottish Parliament and Scottish Government can seek to design an immigration system that works for Scotland.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
