*<u>S5M-22239</u> Michelle Ballantyne: Scottish Borders Book Festival 2020—That the Parliament recognises that the Scottish Borders Book Festival 2020 is moving to an online format; understands that a series of 12 talks has been organised to stream online every Sunday from 12 July and will include pre-recorded sessions with returning favourites, James Naughtie and Rory Bremner, as well as new faces, such as the Borderer, Suzanne Mulholland, who achieved internet fame as The Batch Lady for her batch cooking YouTube videos; notes that each pre-recorded talk will be followed by a Q&A session with the author, which will allow the usual festival interaction to take place; considers that streaming the festival online will help to broaden access to people who live far away or who could not otherwise attend and will help to promote the Borders to a wider audience, and welcomes the Chancellor's UK-wide £1.57 billion arts and culture support package, which, it believes, will help to sustain community venues, arts projects and cultural events throughout the COVID-19 crisis.

<u>S5M-22238</u> Jeane Freeman: Social Care Staff Support Fund (Coronavirus) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 (SSI 2020/188)—That the COVID-19 Committee recommends that the Social Care Staff Support Fund (Coronavirus) (Scotland) Regulations 2020 (SSI 2020/188) be approved. Supported by: Michael Russell, Joe FitzPatrick*, Clare Haughey*

*<u>S5M-22237</u> Fulton MacGregor: Lack of Financial Support for the Self-employed—That the Parliament notes the acute difficulties facing self-employed people as a result of the economic impact of COVID-19; understands that self-employed people in particular have been ineligible for any form of government financial support, due to current UK Government rules; considers that this has left these workers stranded and unable to access financial support through the Self-Employment Income Support Scheme or the furlough scheme; urges the UK Government to deliver a package of measures that includes a commitment to extend the furlough scheme beyond its October 2020 deadline and put into place vital financial support for those who currently are not entitled to any support from current UK Government schemes; considers the availability of universal credit to be insufficient to allow people to both live and protect their businesses, and calls

on the UK Government to end disparities in its COVID-19 support packages that it considers are currently putting livelihoods and businesses at risk.

*<u>S5M-22236</u> Maurice Golden: Braehead Shopping Centre's Safe Re-opening Plan—That the Parliament welcomes the news that Braehead Shopping Centre has produced a plan to safely reopen, which focuses on ensuring the safety of shoppers and workers, with social distancing and hygiene procedures in place; notes that the plan includes limiting the number of people in the centre at one time, one-way systems and training staff to support visitors in maintaining the regulations; acknowledges the implementation of an enhanced hygiene regimen, which includes increased deep-cleaning, the installation of automatic hand sanitiser dispensers and providing staff with PPE; believes that this work will help ensure that people will have confidence to visit and work in the Centre; considers that a successful re-opening will help demonstrate its value to the area's economy, and hopes to see its long-term future guaranteed as soon as possible.

*<u>S5M-22235</u> James Kelly: West Whitlawburn Housing Co-op—That the Parliament recognises the efforts of the West Whitlawburn Housing Co-operative, which has distributed in excess of 1,500 food parcels during the COVID-19 pandemic, notes the efforts of staff from the Co-op and Whitlawburn Community Centre who have overseen the delivery of the food parcels to tenants members, and thanks everyone for their efforts in ensuring vulnerable members of the community have not been isolated during lockdown.

*<u>S5M-22234</u> Mark Ruskell: Celebrating National Meadows Day—That the Parliament recognises National Meadows Day; understands that the day celebrates the beauty and biodiversity of wildflower meadows, while also drawing attention to their loss and vulnerability; notes the importance of maintaining and expanding meadows in tackling the climate emergency; supports Plantlife Scotland's call for current environmental standards to be maintained or enhanced after the UK is no longer covered by EU regulations, and recognises with concern that, since 1930, over 97% of meadows and other species rich grasslands have been destroyed.

*<u>S5M-22233</u> Rona Mackay: Thomas Muir's Restoration to the Faculty of Advocates—That the Parliament celebrates Thomas Muir of Huntershill, the "father of Scottish democracy", being restored to the roll of the Faculty of Advocates; understands that Muir was an advocate and political reformer in late 18th century Scotland who, during an age of revolution, promoted democratic ideas, including support for universal suffrage; notes that Muir practised as an advocate from 1787 until being struck off in 1793 following his indictment by Lord Braxfield of the High Court of Justiciary on the charge of sedition; understands that, while he was facing trial, and was a fugitive from justice, the Faculty expelled him from membership, and notes that the expulsion was overturned due to new documents that proved a decree of fugitation lodged against Muir had never held legal effect and so voided the grounds for his expulsion.

*<u>S5M-22231</u> Lewis Macdonald: Future Delivery of UK Development Assistance—That the Parliament notes the proposed merger of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and the Department for International Development (DfID) to create a new department from 1 September 2020; acknowledges the call by Scotland's leading international development organisations for this department to endorse four key pledges to enable it to maintain what it sees has been the UK's global leadership in the delivery of international development assistance for over 20 years; supports the call for a commitment to poverty eradication and aid effectiveness, for accountability, transparency and scrutiny, for the delivery on the UN Sustainable Development Agenda and the Paris Agreement on Climate Change and the safeguarding of the world-class expertise built up by DfID at East Kilbride and elsewhere to continue to deliver overseas development assistance where it is needed most; calls for commitments by the UK and Scottish governments to provide global citizenship education for young people; believes that the principles of global citizenship apply to governments as well as people, and calls for these principles to be applied to future decisions on the structure, strategy, policies and priorities of the proposed new department.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
