*<u>S5M-21959</u> Mark Griffin: Carers Week 2020—That the Parliament welcomes Carers Week 2020, which is an annual campaign that, this year, takes place from 8 to 14 June on the theme of "Making Caring Visible" and coming together to recognise the contribution of hundreds of thousands of unpaid carers and young carers in Scotland; acknowledges that it is organised by five charities in Scotland, Carers Scotland, Carers Trust Scotland, MND Scotland, Oxfam Scotland and Age Scotland; understands that there will be hundreds of events held virtually across Scotland, which will reach out to thousands of carers and young carers; recognises the significant and vital contribution of unpaid carers during the COVID-19 pandemic, and considers that the impact of caring on the health and wellbeing of carers, including social isolation, should not be underestimated; understands that the support that carers provide is worth more than £10.8 billion to the economy each year; considers that every effort should be made to ensure that carers receive the support that they need, including support to reduce the impact of the pandemic on their lives and recognise their particular needs as lockdown eases, and wishes Carers Week every success.

*<u>S5M-21958</u> Colin Beattie: MYPAS Awarded £139,000 in Funding—That the Parliament congratulates MYPAS on being awarded £139,000 by The Henry Smith Charity; understands that this will be used to provide three years' funding for a full-time counsellor to deliver counselling to young people aged between 12 and 18 in Midlothian; considers that the services provided by MYPAS in Midlothian are in high demand and are critical to the young people of the constituency; highlights the importance of mental health services being provided to young people across Scotland; supports the continued provision of such valuable services to the young people of Midlothian, including those provided by MYPAS, which has been providing counselling services in the area for over 20 years, and wishes everyone involved all the best going forward with this funding.

recognises that the COVID-19 pandemic has brought new opportunities and challenges for volunteers, including the launch of mutual-aid groups that support vulnerable people with the provision of food, as well as valuable support for those in the shielding group; understands that, following the incredible volunteer response to the COVID-19 pandemic, this year's focus is on expressing thanks, gratitude and recognition of the work that volunteers do; considers that, as well as helping others, volunteering has been shown to improve volunteers' wellbeing, boost confidence and can help volunteers gain valuable new skills and experiences, and believes that the estimated annual value of volunteers helping UK charities is £22.6 billion.

*<u>S5M-21956</u> Michelle Ballantyne: Donald Dewar Memorial Debating Tournament—That the Parliament congratulates pupils from Peebles High School on winning the Law Society of Scotland's Donald Dewar Memorial Debating Tournament; understands that the subject of the debate was "Universal Basic Income" and was held remotely using video conferencing, the first such occurrence in the tournament's history; notes that teams from Peebles High School have now won the tournament twice in the last three years; commends the teachers and pupils from the school, as well as the other finalists, on their hard work and dedication, and wishes them all the best for the future.

*<u>S5M-21955</u> Alison Johnstone: Benefit Cap—That the Parliament understands that the benefit cap is an overall limit on the amount of social security payments a household can receive; expresses disappointment that that recent improvements to the rates of some social security payments will not be received in full by some households due to the application of the benefit cap; understands that the independent Social Security Advisory Committee has brought these concerns to the attention of the Department for Work and Pensions, additionally pointing out that "claimants would normally have the option to move into paid work or to move home to avoid the impact of the benefit cap, but neither of these are realistic choices for many people at the current time"; believes that the provision of social security support should be based on need, not an arbitrary limit, and calls on the UK Government to permanently abolish the benefit cap.

*S5M-21954 Mary Fee: National Carers Week—That the Parliament recognises that 8 to 14 June 2020 is National Carers Week, which is an annual event that seeks to highlight the work of unpaid carers, with the theme for this year being "Making Caring Visible"; acknowledges that the COVID-19 pandemic has been an incredibly difficult time for carers, physically, financially and emotionally, with 70% of carers providing more care due to the virus; considers that everyone needs to do all that they can to promote the work of unpaid carers and the contribution that they make to their local communities; understands that unpaid carers are seven times lonelier than the general public and that lockdown has only made this more apparent; recognises that the pandemic has disproportionately impacted young and young adult carers, with many experiencing significantly increased anxiety levels and difficulty in accessing food as a result of the pandemic; supports the work of Renfrewshire Carers Centre and the resilience that it has shown during the pandemic by drastically adapting its services, which has included helping with shopping and prescriptions, distributing PPE, increasing telephone support to carers and online support groups and training via Zoom; encourages carers in Renfrewshire to take part in the week of events that Renfrewshire Carers Centre is running online; appreciates that, without these vital frontline workers, it would not be possible to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic, and advocates that everyone does all that they can to provide information, support and understanding to all carers in Scotland.

*S5M-21953 Mark McDonald: Mintra Group's Skilled Worker Portal Offers Free Learning to

Oil and Gas Workers—That the Parliament congratulates the Aberdeen-based Mintra Group on the launch of its Skilled Worker Portal; applauds the support that Mintra is offering to furloughed and redundant workers in the oil and gas industry during the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that the portal is an online learning management and training resource providing free access to 15 key industry courses, including health, safety, environmental and technical courses, to give learners the opportunity to plug gaps in periodic training requirements during their current downtime; notes that the course material is written to accredited standards and that, on completion, participants will be provided with a Mintra certificate, and welcomes this positive initiative at a time when there is so much uncertainty throughout the industry, the country and the world.

*<u>S5M-21952</u> Clare Adamson: Remembering the Humanitarian and Aid Worker, Alan

Witcutt—That the Parliament notes with sadness the death of the humanitarian aid worker, Alan Witcutt; notes that Alan, a devout Christadelphian, spent his National Service at Polkemmet Colliery in West Lothian after his appeal to be treated as a conscientious objector on religious grounds was rejected; further notes that he, and his wife, Christine, travelled from their Wishaw home to Bosnia with the Scottish charity, Edinburgh Direct Aid, and recognises that Christine was killed by a sniper in Sarajevo in 1993; understands that, following his wife's death, Alan began delivering talks and sermons on the subject of forgiveness, some of which have been recorded in the National Library of Scotland; acknowledges that the family's tragic Bosnian experience has been used to promote forgiveness, compassion and an understanding of the Balkan conflicts, including in Overtown Primary School where Christine had taught; understands that Alan returned to Sarajevo with his family in 2001, where they opened a centre and outreach programme for children with complex support needs, funded by the Christine Witcutt Memorial Fund, which was established in his wife's memory, and for which he raised large amounts of money; acknowledges that Alan was presented with a medal by the Bosnian Government for his and his wife's humanitarian work, and sends its heartfelt condolences to his family.

*<u>S5M-21951</u> Ben Macpherson: Local Government Finance (Coronavirus) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2020 [draft]—That the Local Government and Communities Committee recommends that the Local Government Finance (Coronavirus) (Scotland) Amendment Order 2020 [draft] be approved.

natural voice tones; commends the team at SpeakUnique on their launch and the positive impact the service will have on those who have lost their voice due to medical conditions such as MND, and wishes everyone involved with the SpeakUnique project the very best for the future.
