—That the Parliament notes with alarm the results of two surveys carried out by Carers of West Lothian on 127 carers and 24 people living with disabilities in West Lothian; understands that 65% of unpaid carers are providing more care now when compared with that prior to lockdown, 59% said their own mental wellbeing has been affected with 29% feeling overwhelmed, 71% are worried about what will happen if they get ill and that 53% are worried about going to public places; further understands that, for those living with disabilities, 75% feel lonely and cut off from friends, 38% feel less independent now, 46% of people feel that the needs of disabled people have not been properly considered, with only 17% feeling they had, 63% are worried about what will happen if they get ill, and 54% are worried about their mental and physical wellbeing; believes that carers and disabled people should be given more support during the lockdown, and commends Carers of West Lothian for providing its support during this pandemic.
