**Partnership**—That the Parliament welcomes the announcement of a new partnership between Heriot-Watt University and the Glasgow-based brewer, Brewgooder, to encourage more black, Asian and minority ethnic (BAME) students to develop a career in brewing and distilling; believes that the bursary programme will start from summer 2021 with the aim of improving diversity in the brewing industry; notes that each successful student will receive £2,000 each year from Brewgooder for a total of four years, while studying on the BSc (Hons) Brewing and Distilling course based at the International Centre for Brewing and Distilling at Heriot-Watt University; further notes that the International Centre for Brewing and Distilling was the home of Scotland's first black professor, Sir Geoff Palmer, who taught cereal science at the University and is an ardent campaigner for human rights and racial equality, and looks forward to a new generation of brewers and distillers truly representing Scotland's multicultural diversity.

\*<u>S5M-22098</u> John Mason: Congratulating Ireland and Norway—That the Parliament congratulates Ireland and Norway after they were elected to the UN Security Council by other UN members; welcomes the important role played by small European nations on the world stage relating to issues such as climate change, the challenging of poverty and inequality and the promotion of peace globally; understands the importance of international organisations and intergovernmental organisations in tackling societal and global issues, and believes that Scotland, as a small European nation, can also play its part on the world stage, notwithstanding what it considers to be the growing insularity of the UK and the current Conservative UK administration.

\*<u>S5M-22095</u> Neil Findlay: Justice for the Victims of Orgreave—That the Parliament notes that 18 June 2020 is the 36th anniversary of the "Battle of Orgreave" during the miners' strike; understands that, on that day, thousands of Police lured pickets into a trap outside Orgreave coking plant, then attacked them with batons, horses, dogs and shields; further understands that 95 pickets were arrested with many charged with rioting, but that all charges were dismissed in court when officers were found to have perjured themselves, duplicated statements and lied; considers this to be one of the darkest days in the year-long strike, and an event that still causes huge pain in coalfield communities, and supports the Orgreave Truth and Justice Campaign's call for a full public inquiry into events that day and justice for all those miners who were present, including a number from the Lothian, Lanarkshire, Fife and Ayrshire coalfield communities.

# **Members' Bills Proposals**

#### Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
