*S5M-21348 Angela Constance: Livingston FC Caring in the Community—That the Parliament congratulates Livingston FC on its ongoing efforts to support those in need in the local community by giving away free meals to local causes, nominated by 10 charities; understands that players, coaching and non-playing staff at the club all make a monthly contribution from their wages to cover the costs of meals for those needing help, but that, with the club shut down due to COVID-19, they decided to continue pitching in for meals by donating the food to local causes; understands that the Head Chef, Maureen O'Driscoll, attends the club daily, cooking the meals, and is permitted to continue doing so during the national lockdown; commends the club for its actions, and appreciates the efforts of all involved.

*S5M-21347 Michelle Ballantyne: Stow COVID-19 Action Group—That the Parliament commends Jenna Macvie on setting up the Stow COVID-19 Action Group; understands that the group is providing a delivery service for people self-isolating due to COVID-19, and will assist with the collection of parcels, prescriptions and essential comestibles; notes that the group will also be making soup to deliver at low cost to those unable to leave their homes; thanks Jenna and the volunteers for their hard work, and wishes them all the best with their service.

*S5M-21346 Michelle Ballantyne: Destination Tweed—That the Parliament welcomes the National Lottery Heritage Fund grant of £299,000 for the Destination Tweed project, which is being developed by the Tweed Forum in collaboration with Scottish Borders Council and aims to create a 100-mile trail from the source of the Tweed near Moffat to where it meets the sea at Berwick-upon-Tweed; notes that the trail will encourage tourism to the Borders and will create a focal point for environmental conservation and development projects, as well as allow for archaeological interpretation; acknowledges that it will cost an estimated £20 million to develop and that the Borderlands Partnership has already committed to providing £11 million; commends the work of all the organisations involved in the planning of Destination Tweed, and wishes them all the best with its development.

For each Bill, the date of the next (or most recent) event in the Bill's passage is given. Other relevant information, e.g. about lodging amendments, is given in italics.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
