#### Other new and altered motions and amendments

\*<u>S5M-21350</u> Claudia Beamish: Consultation on Wild Wrasse Fisheries—That the Parliament notes the decision by the Scottish Government to consult on measures to regulate the wild wrasse fishery in Scotland's inshore waters; believes that the sustainability of the wrasse fishery directly affects the future of Scotland's aquaculture sector, of other wild fisheries, and of protected marine ecosystems, such as kelp forests and rocky reefs; regrets that this consultation does not invite respondents to recommend a different closed season, or spatial protection, or for stock data to be required before reopening the fishery, and urges the Scottish Government to produce a new consultation document urgently so that all the options can be considered prior to the scheduled opening of the fishery on 1 May 2020.

\*S5M-21349 Donald Cameron: Chest, Heart and Stroke Scotland's Call for Kindness

**Volunteers**—That the Parliament welcomes the call from Chest, Heart and Stroke Scotland for people to become "kindness' volunteers" to help those who are vulnerable in the Highlands and Islands and across Scotland during the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that the charity is advertising for volunteers who can provide regular kindness calls to lonely, scared or worried people, or who can help with deliveries and drop-offs of shopping and vital supplies, or who can drive vulnerable people or share important health information online; recognises the importance of volunteering, particularly in the current climate, and the massive positive impact that this has on people's mental health and wellbeing, and wishes Chest, Heart and Stroke Scotland well with this important endeavour.

<u>S5W-28118</u> Fulton MacGregor: To ask the Scottish Government how COVID-19 is impacting on the delivery of national screening programmes, immunisation and the implementation of the Human Tissue (Authorisation) (Scotland) Act 2019.

<u>S5W-28090</u> Daniel Johnson: To ask the Scottish Government what assistance and support it is providing to people moving house during the COVID-19 outbreak due to the temporary closure of the Registers of Scotland, and what the legal position is of those who had already changed missives before the closure was announced.

The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
