*S5M-23343 Neil Bibby: Tied Pubs (Scotland) Bill—That the Parliament agrees to the general principles of the Tied Pubs (Scotland) Bill.

*<u>S5M-23342</u> Lewis Macdonald: Supply and Demand for Medicines—That the Parliament notes the conclusions and recommendations contained in the Health and Sport Committee's 6th Report 2019 (Session 5), Supply and demand for medicines (SP Paper 774).

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S5M-23349 Fulton MacGregor: The Alternative and Augmentative Communication Law—That the Parliament acknowledges the Scottish Government's activity to support the effective implementation of the alternative and augmentative communication (AAC) law. which commenced in March 2018, including through the publication of a shared vision that "People who have difficulty speaking and who can be assisted by communication equipment have the right to get the equipment and support they need to use it, when they need it, whoever they are and wherever they live in Scotland, enabling them to participate in their communities and be fully included in society"; welcomes two independent reports from the AAC Collaborative, the Royal College of Speech and Language Therapists and AAC SLT Leaders in Scotland, which examine the impact of the law from the perspective of people who use AAC and the speech and language therapists who provide equipment and support services in the Coatbridge and Chryston constituency and across the country; notes that the reports recognise that although AAC equipment and support provision has shown some improvement since 2018, there remain gaps in the provision of equipment and support needed to achieve the shared vision; acknowledges that the COVID-19 pandemic has led to greater need for effective communication for all; commends those involved for bringing these reports to the parliament's attention, and notes the calls encouraging the further and ongoing efforts by all service providers to ensure that everyone in Scotland who needs AAC equipment and the support to use it can access it in a timely manner for as long as they need it.

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*S5M-23347 Stewart Stevenson: Recognising the Importance of Whole Grains on International Whole Grain Day—That the Parliament acknowledges International Whole Grain Day, which takes place on 19 November 2020; notes that whole grain consumption has a positive impact on nutrition, wellbeing, sustainability and has a proven role in reducing heart disease, type 2 diabetes, obesity and cancer; understands that, according to the Scottish Government, current fibre intakes in Scotland are sitting at an average of 16 grams per day and would have to nearly double to meet the recommended dietary guideline of 30 grams per day; believes that wholegrain foods have an important part to play in helping people achieve the 30g goal for daily fibre intake; notes calls for public awareness campaigns on the benefits of whole grains, the need for an agreed definition on what should be considered whole grain foods, and for front of pack labelling schemes to recognise fibre, and considers Whole Grain Day an excellent opportunity to encourage healthier eating habits and create dialogue around how eating habits can improve lives.

Other new and altered motions and amendments

*S5M-23348 Fulton MacGregor: Jupiter Play and Leisure —That the Parliament celebrates the work of Jupiter Play and Leisure in ensuring that outdoor play spaces are inclusive for disabled children; understands that Jupiter has developed its Play Inclusive Play Areas Toolkit, which helps authorities building outdoor play areas ensure the spaces are inclusive; understands that this is a first in the UK; acknowledges that one in 20 children live with a disability, meaning that many young people are excluded from outdoor play due to accessibility issues; commends Jupiter's work in Drumpellier Country Park, Coatbridge to create The Crannog, which is a fully-inclusive playground; recognises the benefit of outdoor play for children and young people; believes that this has been highlighted by the COVID-19 pandemic, and acknowledges the Scottish Government's commitment to outdoor and inclusive play.

*S5M-23346 Mary Fee: Trans Day of Remembrance—That the Parliament recognises that 20 November 2020 is Trans Day of Remembrance, an annual day that exists to honour, commemorate and memorialise the lives of trans and gender-diverse people who have been murdered across the globe in the last year; notes that 350 transgender and gender diverse people have been killed in the last year, which is 6% more than in 2019, and that this brings the total number to 3,664 in the last 12 years; understands that 98% of those murdered were trans women or trans feminine people; acknowledges that aggregated data included in a research report by Transrespect versus Transphobia Worldwide indicates that Black and migrant trans women of colour are more vulnerable and frequently targeted; understands that only 5% of trans people under the age of 25 in the UK feel very comfortable being LGBT in the UK and that 48% of trans people under 26 have attempted suicide; understands that data from 2018 found that 41% of trans people in the UK had experienced a hate crime or incident because of their gender identity in the previous 12 months, and that 25% of trans people had directly experienced transphobic abuse online, and endeavours to do all that it can to mitigate hate crimes toward trans and gender diverse people in Scotland and to offer the best support and guidance that it can to trans and gender diverse people in communities across Scotland.

*<u>S5M-23345</u> Finlay Carson: UNESCO Celebrates 75 years—That the Parliament congratulates the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), which, on 16 November 2020, celebrated 75 years since being founded in London; notes that the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire UNESCO Biosphere designation is part of a remarkable national and global

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network that brings in £151 million of financial benefit to local UK economies each year, and builds bridges between people, culture and nature around the world; acknowledges that The Galloway and Southern Ayrshire Biosphere is part of this extraordinary global movement working towards a long and meaningful peace; considers that biosphere teams have been instrumental in working with local businesses, communities and land managers to raise awareness and encourage action to address sustainability issues that are now being actively highlighted as part of the response to the post-COVID-19 Green Recovery, resulting in over 340 businesses, communities, individuals and local organisations signing up to the biosphere sustainability ethos as "Proud Supporters"; acknowledges that 25 businesses are going through UNESCO's Biosphere Certification Scheme, which audits the sustainability credentials of key goods and services that it delivers; notes what it considers significant new funding support from the South of Scotland Enterprise agency, alongside existing support from local authority partners, and welcomes the Galloway and Southern Ayrshire Biosphere in its drive to put sustainability at the heart of everything that is done by "Acting Local", which it considers the perfect foundations for establishing Scotland's next National Park in Galloway.

*S5M-23344 Elaine Smith: Industrial Dispute on CalMac Ferries—That the Parliament understands that RMT members are being consulted by their trade union on industrial action following the collapse of annual pay talks with CalMac; supports all seafarers, port and clerical staff at CalMac, who continue to risk their own health and that of their families to maintain lifeline public services on Clyde and Hebridean ferry routes during the pandemic; is alarmed at reports that three crew members on the MV Isle of Lewis, the 25-year-old ferry working between Oban and Castlebay on Barra, recently tested positive for COVID-19; understands that the existing 0.5% pay offer would cost the employer £450,000, and that the income of the highest paid director at CalMac was £165,000 in 2018-19, and calls on CalMac to return to the negotiating table with an improved pay offer to better reflect the needs of CalMac workers, passengers and communities across the west of Scotland. R

*S5M-23341 Pauline McNeill: Two-tier Dental Health System—That the Parliament is concerned that Scotland is developing a two-tier dental health system; understands that people are facing long queues if they try to access an NHS dentist; further understands that some patients are being told to seek quicker treatment by going to private practice; notes recent reports of the Chief Dental Officer saying "I don't think an NHS patient should be told to go private. I think that's an invidious position to put a patient into"; believes that this situation will affect adults and children in the most deprived areas most severely as adults in deprived areas are more likely to be registered with an NHS dentist and children in deprived areas are more likely to have higher levels of tooth decay; understands that it is the profession itself that is highlighting what it sees as this increasing inequality faced by those on the lowest incomes, and calls on the Scottish Government to tackle this issue without delay.
