\*S5M-22992 Alexander Stewart: World Stroke Day and Stroke Care in Scotland During the COVID-19 Pandemic—That the Parliament recognises World Stroke Day, which is observed on 29 October each year to raise awareness of stroke and what can be done to tackle the condition; understands that stroke is a non-communicable disease that affects millions of people worldwide every year; believes that, although the COVID-19 pandemic has had a huge impact on everyone, the lives and recoveries of stroke survivors in Mid Scotland and Fife, and across Scotland, have been particularly badly affected; recognises what it sees as the disparity in the levels of stroke care between NHS boards in Scotland; acknowledges the publication of the Stroke Association report, *Stroke recoveries at risk*, which highlights how much stroke survivors' lives and their recoveries have been affected, and notes the calls on the Scotlish Government to make urgent progress on the stroke commitments that it made prior to the COVID-19 pandemic in its Programme for Government 2019-20, as well as on the establishment of a regular reporting mechanism to the Parliament on these commitments in order to track progress and ensure full transparency and accountability.

\*S5M-23004 Annie Wells: World COPD Day—That the Parliament recognises that World COPD Day takes place on 18 November 2020; notes that this is organised by the Global Initiative for Chronic Obstructive Lung Disease (GOLD) in collaboration with health care professionals and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) patient groups across the world; understands that its aim are to raise awareness about COPD and improve its care worldwide; is pleased that the 2020 theme is "Living Well with COPD – Everybody Everywhere"; recognises the importance of the message of living well with COPD, especially as over 141,140 people in Scotland are diagnosed with the condition, with many more people who are undiagnosed; believes that up to two-thirds of people with COPD remain undiagnosed and, without optimal treatment, progressive lung disease reduces their guality of life; recognises the need for early diagnosis and screening to ensure that those affected by COPD receive the treatment that they need; notes that, with the right support, it is possible to live well and self-manage the condition; recognises the significant importance of living well with the condition as people learn to live with the threat of COVID-19 to the respiratory and general health of people in Scotland; understands that, of the 80,000 people shielding with a respiratory condition, a significant proportion have COPD; praises NHS staff across Scotland who have treated people with COPD as well as COVID-19 during the ongoing pandemic, and recognises the dedication of charities, such as Asthma UK and the British Lung Foundation Partnership, to protecting and informing people living with COPD, before, during and after the pandemic.

\*<u>S5M-22998</u> John Mason: World Mental Health Day 2020—That the Parliament acknowledges that 10 October 2020 is World Mental Health Day; recognises that the day seeks to raise awareness of mental health issues across the world and also seeks to advocate for greater support for mental health; further recognises the prevalence of mental health issues across Scotland, which it considers have been made worse by COVID-19 and the necessary restrictions that have been put in place; believes that, while there is a high prevalence of mental health issues, these are not equally distributed and that there are severe mental health inequalities, with adults living in the most deprived areas reportedly being twice as likely to have common mental health issues and organisations in Scotland such as SAMH; believes that the increasing awareness and debating of mental health issues in the Parliament is beneficial for the development of ways to tackle these issues; further believes, however, that health policy is, unfortunately, an area of over-politicisation and political point-scoring, and advocates that parties work together, collaboratively and with third sector organisations to develop policies that ensure people with mental health issues have access to the best possible care.
