\*<u>S5M-23014</u> Christine Grahame: Solicitors in the Supreme Courts of Scotland (Amendment) Bill—That the Parliament agrees that the Solicitors in the Supreme Courts of Scotland (Amendment) Bill be passed.

#### \*S5M-23016 Lewis Macdonald: World's First Hydrogen Double-decker Bus Arrives in

**Aberdeen**—That the Parliament welcomes the arrival of what it understands is the world's first hydrogen-powered double-decker bus in Aberdeen; understands that this is the first of a fleet of 15 double-decker hydrogen buses built in Northern Ireland, which will be operated by First Aberdeen, as part of an £8.3 million project funded by Aberdeen City Council, the Scottish Government and the European Union's JIVE project, which aims to aid commercialisation of hydrogen buses through joint procurement between cities; recognises that the introduction of hydrogen-powered double-decker buses is only the latest in a series of what it considers ground-breaking hydrogen projects in the city, which have featured, to date, council-owned single-decker buses, council service vehicles and a £19 million hydrogen refuelling station at Kittybrewster, all of which are part of Aberdeen's commitment to the Net Zero Vision and energy transition; considers that this latest project, led by Aberdeen City Council, is testing both the economic and environmental benefits of hydrogen transport, while driving the development of hydrogen technologies, and looks forward to future investment in transformative hydrogen power projects in Aberdeen and across Scotland.

**Competition 2020**—That the Parliament congratulates Harray Young Farmers on reaching the final of the Scottish Association of Young Farmers Clubs Bale Art Competition 2020; understands that clubs that enter the competition are set the creative task of decorating field bales into colourful characters and designs, with this year's theme to design "something to make you smile"; acknowledges that 50 clubs across Scotland took on the challenge, including East Mainland and Sandwick young farmers clubs in Orkney; recognises that Harray Young Farmers reached the final

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alongside 11 other clubs for their ingenious "Wallace and Gromit make you cheese" entry; pays tribute to the eventual winners, Lower Speyside Young Farmers, as well as Bathgate JAC and Forfar JAC, which finished second and third respectively; recognises that this year's competition raised important funds for the Royal Scottish Agricultural Benevolent Institution (RSABI) to support its work in providing financial and practical help to farmers and crofters across Scotland; further recognises that the event raised awareness of RSABI's "keep talking" campaign, which aims to encourage farmers and crofters to look after their mental health and wellbeing, and to highlight the importance of staying connected with each other; congratulates all those who took part on their excellent efforts and hard work to make this year's competition a success and produce a high standard of entries, and wishes everyone all the best for next year's event.

\*<u>S5M-23013</u> Andy Wightman: World Homeless Day—That the Parliament recognises that 10 October 2020 is the 10th annual World Homeless Day, which will aim to draw attention to the needs of homeless people; welcomes the combined efforts of local government, charities and central government in working to house people without access to permanent housing during the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that a secure and suitable home is a basic human right; supports the organisations and volunteers aiming to end homelessness, and believes that the provision of genuinely affordable housing for all who need it is crucial to addressing what it sees as Scotland's housing crisis.

\*S5M-23012 Neil Findlay: City of Edinburgh Council Budget Deficit—That the Parliament expresses its concern at the City of Edinburgh Council's reported proposal to address its budget deficit by cutting staffing costs through the implementation of a severance scheme worth £14.5 million and by reducing staff hours; considers this an appalling way to treat essential council workers such as refuse collectors, social care workers, craft workers and social workers, and many more key staff, who it believes have worked hard throughout the pandemic to keep the streets clean, homes safe for tenants, the city moving and the vulnerable safe and cared for; understands that the Edinburgh Poverty Commission highlighted in a recent report that almost 15% of Edinburgh's population live in poverty, including one in five children, and that Edinburgh has to become a living wage city within the next 12 months to challenge poverty; further understands that local authorities face a combined funding shortfall of £739 million due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which is expected to top £1 billion by the end of the year; recognises the seriousness of the challenge facing Edinburgh, which it understands has a deficit of £12.5 million; believes that the solution is in a fair funding model for local government that protects jobs and terms and conditions of local government workers, and enhances the role of local government and the public sector in expanding employment opportunities to deliver improved services to tackle the serious challenges ahead, and calls on the Scottish Government to take immediate steps to address what it considers the funding crisis in the city.

\*<u>S5M-23011</u> Claudia Beamish: Healthy Valleys Organisation, Clydesdale—That the Parliament welcomes the announcement that the Clydesdale-based Healthy Valleys organisation has received £150,624 from the Inspiring Scotland fund to deliver its Resilient Families project, which will see the it running perinatal and infant mental health services for the rural area via its Resilient Families Team; believes that, more than ever before, families face increasing challenges, and that this award will allow the team to help alleviate these challenges and promote positive family mental health and wellbeing; notes the aim to help parents develop their knowledge, skills,

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resilience and confidence to manage their circumstances and improve the lives and life chances of themselves and their children; congratulates Healthy Valleys on its efforts, and wishes it every success, including with this project. **R**
