<u>S5M-23756</u> Gillian Martin: Impact of COVID-19 on Women in the Economy—That the Parliament recognises the impact of COVID-19 on women in the economy; understands that women in the Aberdeenshire East constituency and across the country have been more adversely affected economically by the pandemic, with the Gender Equality Index showing that they spent more time on housework and caring than men; notes the view that women should be supported as

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part of the economic recovery, and pays tribute to the work that has already been carried out by Women's Enterprise Scotland, Engender and Close the Gap to make sure women's voices are heard in the strive for a more equal wellbeing economy.

followed by Members' Business (Virtual): Emma Harper: The Potential for a Galloway National Park

S5M-23892 Emma Harper: The Potential for a Galloway National Park—That the Parliament recognises the Galloway National Park Association's work in promoting the establishment of a national park in the area as potentially Scotland's third such development; considers that this could bring positive benefits to mental and physical health, conservation, the environment, the economy and future sustainability; understands that, in 2017, following the publication of a discussion paper and a period of community consultation and engagement, the Association published, A Galloway National Park- It's Our Time, which identified the goal of the proposed park as to promote an attractive and healthy natural and cultural environment that will benefit the communities of Galloway both socially and economically, and offer broader benefits to others, including visitors, and provide a vibrant and sustainable future in which the region's young people can flourish; recognises that the paper aims to strengthen the argument for the establishment of the national park in the area, ultimately leading to the development of further national parks; understands that, ahead of the COP26 conference, the Scottish Government has committed in its Statement of Intent on Biodiversity for an additional 7.3% of land to be designated as protected to meet the proposed UN 2030 target; considers that a Galloway national park could provide an ideal opportunity to help achieve this; believes that national parks, and protected outdoor green spaces, provide opportunities for people to access the outdoors and try new activities; considers that they promote positive health and wellbeing that can reduce stress, depression and help address physical health conditions such as obesity and type 2 diabetes as part of a social prescribing approach; thanks the Association and its Chair, Rob Lucas, and President, Dame Barbara Kelly, for their work so far on this issue, and notes calls for the Scottish Government to set out, in principle, its position on a national park for Galloway, which could proudly be Scotland's third national park.

Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

*S5M-24111 Gil Paterson: 80th Anniversary of the Clydebank Blitz—That the Parliament recognises that, on the evenings of 13 and 14 March 1941, Clydebank was extensively and systematically bombed; acknowledges that the Clydebank Blitz saw 99% of all houses in the town damaged or razed to the ground and that the devastating and tragic event caused 528 deaths, left 617 seriously injured and resulted in untold numbers of walking wounded; believes that, although the targets were reputed to be shipyards and the substantial industrial complexes in the locality, it was the town that bore the brunt of this intensive bombing; acknowledges and commends the action of the many in the emergency services and the general public for their considerable bravery; expresses its gratitude to the crew of the Polish Navy destroyer, ORP Piorun, who courageously and voluntarily drew fire on the vessel as it was docked for a refit at John Brown's shipyard, and notes that this act of selfless bravery is recognised by the people of Clydebank who have dedicated a civic space in their honour, which is known as Solidarity Plaza and is adjacent to the town hall, where an annual service of commemoration is held to both thank and acknowledge the brave contribution of the Polish Navy.

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step further by attaching heartfelt poems, which she wrote herself, to let patients and their families know they were loved; acknowledges Josie and the many others who have contributed to this appeal to ensure that patients, residents and their loved ones still feel connected, and thanks Josie and the other contributors for their selfless acts of kindness towards others during these difficult times.

*S5M-24112 Neil Findlay: Tesco—That the Parliament notes with great concern reports that Tesco will pay a record dividend of 51p per share in 2021; understands that the company is doing so while it is pursuing a so-called fire and rehire policy at five of its distribution centre, including Livingston; believes that the supermarket chain has made huge profits during the COVID-19 pandemic; considers that this is thanks to the hard work and commitment of staff members who have helped keep the country fed, and believes that any move to cut pay and conditions would see Tesco treating these keyworkers with contempt.

*S5M-24098 Neil Findlay: Tesco Fire and Rehire—That the Parliament notes with concern reports that Tesco continues to pursue a so-called "fire and rehire" policy at its distribution centre in Livingston; considers that retail workers, including those in Tesco distribution centres, have worked tirelessly to keep the country fed during the pandemic, while putting their own lives and their families' lives at risk; understands that Tesco is proceeding with face-to-face meetings with employees to discuss their proposal; further understands that the company is bringing staff in from across Scotland, and from England, to conduct these meetings; believes that this cannot be deemed as essential travel during the current COVID-19 restrictions, and urges Tesco once again to withdraw its proposals and cancel its plans for face-to-face meetings, which it believes could put staff at further risk.

*S5M-24081 Bob Doris: New Food Pantry at Courtyard Café, Westercommon, Glasgow—That the Parliament congratulates the partnership between Flourish House and Queens Cross Housing Association on being awarded £21,000 from Glasgow City Council's Town Centre Action Programme Fund to open a food pantry at the Courtyard Café, beside Westercommon flats; notes that the food pantry is also benefiting from £16,000 from the Scottish Government's Community Recovery Fund; pays tribute to the work of all involved at the Courtyard Café, which offers both a café space for the community and jobs at Flourish House by providing transitional and supported employment; thanks all who have supported the Courtyard Café kitchen, which has been well used to provide an emergency food response since the first COVID-19 lockdown; believes that the Scottish Food Pantry Network makes a dignified and effective contribution to tackling poverty, and looks forward to the launch of the Courtyard Food Pantry, which will see members pay £2.50 and receive food of the value of £10 to £15 each visit, with the aim of supporting over 200 users each week.
