*S5M-23999 John Finnie: COVID-19 Vaccination in Territory Occupied by Israel—That the Parliament expresses its anger at the Israeli Government's reported failure to vaccinate Palestinians living in the occupied territories against COVID-19; understands that while Israel has the highest rate of vaccination in the world, Palestinians living in the West Bank and Gaza are being denied the vaccination; notes calls from UN human rights experts to ensure that the Israeli state provides swift and equitable access to the vaccine for Palestinians under occupation; further notes the reported statement from the office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights which states differential access to vaccines in the occupied territories is "morally and legally" unacceptable, and calls on the Israeli authorities to fulfil what it considers their obligations and provide equal access to vaccinations.

*S5M-23998 Gil Paterson: WDCVS Campaign to #WalkBackBetter —That the Parliament acknowledges West Dunbartonshire Community & Volunteering Services' (WDCVS) work to encourage people in West Dunbartonshire to get active and get outdoors in 2021 by supporting the national #WalkBackBetter Campaign; recognises WDCVS's efforts to bring awareness to the benefits of walking on both an individual's physical and mental health, as well as the many other benefits of keeping active, and how it helps people become involved with their local community; notes that it is working with Paths For All, a national walking charity which runs free walking projects in every local authority area in Scotland, to encourage more people to get active, and wishes WDCVS staff and volunteers well with the campaign and future projects to benefit the communities of West Dunbartonshire.

*S5M-23996 Mark Ruskell: Doomsday Clock Set to 100 Seconds to Midnight—That the Parliament notes the Bulletin of Atomic Scientists' Science and Security Board decision to set the Doomsday Clock to 100 seconds to midnight; understands that this means the clock will remain as close as it has ever been to midnight; recognises the organisation's belief that the COVID-19 pandemic has demonstrated that governments and international organisations are unprepared to deal with the "civilisation-ending" threats of climate change; supports the organisation's call for the complete elimination of nuclear arsenals, and hopes that the scientists' warnings are heeded and that governments across the world take the steps necessary to move the clock further from midnight.

*S5M-23993 Mark McDonald: New Commissioner to Champion Rights of People with Autism and Learning Difficulties —That the Parliament notes the 'Our Voice Our Rights' campaign calling for a new commissioner to champion the rights of people with autism and learning disabilities; understands that the commissioner would be the first of its kind in the world; acknowledges the collaboration of charities, Enable Scotland, National Autistic Society Scotland and Scottish Autism; agrees that for too many individuals the reality of their interaction with

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services locally does not match the aspirations of law and national policy and that a commissioner would serve as a means to address this; recognises the daily struggle many of those with autism and learning disabilities have to access their rights to education, work, a family life, healthcare and high-quality social care services; highlights that there are currently an estimated 56,000 autistic people and 120,000 people with a learning disability in Scotland; supports the argument that a commissioner would provide a powerful voice advocating on their behalf with public bodies who have a duty to provide equal access to services and support, and hopes that the Scottish Government will actively consider the creation of such a position in the next session of the Parliament.
