*S5M-24438 Alexander Burnett: Thank You to Royal Mail—That the Parliament commends the Royal Mail for continuing its services throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, during extremely challenging times and while under immense pressure; understands that the Royal Mail has played an essential role throughout the pandemic, from helping friends and families stay connected to keeping the country running with the delivery of NHS vaccination letters and COVID-19 test kits; acknowledges that the Royal Mail also plays a key role ahead of every election in the delivery of postal votes, poll cards and communications from candidates, and will likely see an increase in its services for the upcoming 2021 election; praises it for overcoming the difficulties of having to reorganise its operations due to the pandemic, and applauds all Royal Mail employees, who have kept the country connected.

*S5M-24437 Michael Matheson: Health Protection (Coronavirus) (International Travel etc.) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2021 (SSI 2021/158)—That the Health and Sport Committee recommends that the Health Protection (Coronavirus) (International Travel etc.) (Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2021 (SSI 2021/158) be approved.

*S5M-24436 Elaine Smith: Fair Pay for CalMac COVID-19 Heroes—That the Parliament pays tribute to key public sector workers, including CalMac Ferries' staff, who it considers have risked their lives to maintain lifeline ferry links during the COVID-19 pandemic; supports the 3% pay settlement in 2020-21 for public sector workers; is concerned that, in contrast, seafarers, port and

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other staff at CalMac Ferries were reportedly offered 0.5% in the year of the COVID-19 pandemic, due to, it understands, an anomaly in the Retail Price Index (RPI) for August 2020; expresses further concern regarding reports that CalMac's negotiating team refused to recognise this anomaly, only made one offer, which it said was final, and rejected conciliation through ACAS; believes that such intransigence has led to a dispute situation; understands that the RPI rate since August has averaged 1.18%, and that the 1% pay increase was agreed for seafarers and other ferry workers at Serco NorthLink in 2020-21; notes the 2% pay increase for public sector workers in the Scottish Government's Budget for 2021-22; considers that CalMac Ferries is undervaluing the hard work and sacrifices of key public sector workers in the ongoing pandemic; agrees with the reported view of the RMT that the cost of settling the dispute is minimal; believes that, without resolution, CalMac's treatment of its workers threatens to undermine industrial relations as pandemic restrictions are lifted, and calls on CalMac Ferries to engage proactively with the RMT ahead of the Scottish Parliament election. **R**

*S5M-24435 Jeremy Balfour: Scottish Young Carers Services Alliance—That the Parliament acknowledges the Scottish Young Carers Services Alliance showcase conference, taking place online on 25 March 2021; notes the extensive survey work by young carers' services, which estimates that there are at least 100,000 children and young people in Scotland who have unpaid caring responsibilities; recognises the immense contribution young carers make by providing unpaid care to a family member or friend with an illness, disability, mental illness and/or addiction problems, who could not cope without their support; understands that the COVID-19 pandemic has significantly impacted young people with caring responsibilities, including on their education and health and wellbeing; recognises that recent Carers Trust Scotland research found that 74% of young carers, and 73% of young adult carers, are feeling less connected to others since the COVID-19 pandemic began; notes that children and young people are not always recognised by education and health and social care professionals as undertaking a caring role; believes that mandatory and continued professional development training could improve awareness of young carers needs so professionals are better able to identify and support them; further recognises that young carers can greatly benefit from dedicated young carer support services, and believes that young carers should be identified and provided with appropriate services so that they can reach their full potential and have a life alongside caring.

*S5M-24434 Elaine Smith: Cuba and the US Blockade—That the Parliament recognises that the ongoing US blockade of Cuba has reportedly cost the Cuban economy billions of dollars and caused shortages in essential services; considers that the situation has been exacerbated by the Trump administration's reported designation of Cuba as "state sponsors of terrorism"; believes that this was a politically-motivated move, which has intensified sanctions against the Cuban people in the middle of the COVID-19 pandemic; welcomes the reported recent comments by Juan González, the White House Director for the Western Hemisphere, that the Biden administration is seeking to lift remittance and travel restrictions to Cuba; hopes that measures will be taken to enable Cuba to access materials to produce and deliver millions of doses of COVID-19 vaccines, both to its own population and elsewhere; further hopes that the Scottish Government will establish positive engagement with Cuba to initiate joint projects, such as medical research, and encourages the Biden administration to normalise relations by reversing the reported designation of Cuba as a sponsor of terrorism and ending the blockade. 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*S5M-24433 Angus MacDonald: Falkirk District's Craig Eddie wins The Voice UK—That the Parliament congratulates Craig Eddie, who lives in Falkirk, on winning the ITV singing contest, *The Voice UK*; notes that Craig, who is well known in the Falkirk district as a singer/songwriter, won the contest in the live final of the show, which aired on 20 March 2021, beating three other singers to win a record contract; recognises that Craig is a former pupil of St Francis Xavier Primary School and St Mungo's High School in Falkirk, which had pupils send messages of good luck to him before the final; understands that *The Voice*, which originated in the Netherlands and subsequently premiered in America in 2011, sees four celebrity coaches pick their favourite singers from "blind auditions", judging the singer based on their voice alone, with the UK version of the contest this year featuring Sir Tom Jones, Will.I.Am of the Black Eyed Peas, Olly Murs and Anne-Marie as coaches; further congratulates Craig on winning this series of The Voice, and wishes him the very best of luck with his career, and looks forward to hearing more from him in the future.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
