Members' Business motions that have achieved cross party support

***[S6M-05615](#) Kaukab Stewart: Changing the Boundaries – Ending Institutional Racism in Sport**—That the Parliament notes with concern that the report, *Changing the Boundaries: The Plan4Sport Independent Review into Racism in Scottish Cricket*, found Cricket Scotland to be institutionally racist; understands that the review identified 448 examples demonstrating institutional racism; further notes Sir William MacPherson's definition of institutional racism contained in the 1999 report of the public inquiry into the death of Stephen Lawrence, as "the collective failure of an organisation to provide an appropriate and professional service to people because of their colour, culture or ethnic origin"; acknowledges that institutional racism in sport may not be restricted to Cricket Scotland; recognises what it sees as the detrimental effect of institutional racism on an individual's potential, achievement, health and wellbeing; notes the hope that the implementation of the immediate and long-term recommendations of the independent review will deliver substantial improvements in the experience of people of colour in all sports; further notes the recommendation to improve the diversity of the Cricket Scotland board, and the view that this recommendation, coupled with steps to review diversity at all levels of decision making, can be of great importance in delivering diversity in boards and at all levels of decision making across all sports; notes the view that effective equalities and anti-racist strategies are important in organisations that are in receipt of government funding; welcomes the assessment framework set out in the report; notes the view that this could be used as a conditional part of funding criteria for all funding of sport in Scotland; highlights that ethnically diverse communities are a priority group for sportscotland's 2021-25 Equality Outcomes published in 2022; believes that there are many examples of clubs and individuals delivering local programmes that engage with diverse communities, including in the Glasgow Kelvin constituency; appreciates what it sees as the important work being done by groups including, but not limited to, Show Racism the Red Card, Kick it Out, Running Out Racism; notes the calls for partnership working to eradicate any forms of racism in sport, and looks forward to the day when zero tolerance for any processes, attitudes and behaviour that amount to racial discrimination, through the exclusion of minority ethnic people from participation and talent development opportunities, becomes a reality in Scottish sport.

***[S6M-05669](#) Finlay Carson: Belted Galloway Cattle Society Celebrates its Centenary** —That the Parliament warmly congratulates the Belted Galloway Cattle Society as it celebrates its centenary year, and warmly welcomes the news that the society is thriving as never before with at least one new member signing up every week; acknowledges that the membership currently stands in excess of 500, including associate members and breeders not only in the UK, but Eire, and other parts of the world, such as Canada, New Zealand and America; considers that the many attributes of the Belted Galloway means that it is now at the forefront of sustainable farming practices; notes that having successfully overcome a serious setback caused by outbreaks of foot and mouth disease in 2001 and 2006, the breed is now enjoying a brighter future, as demonstrated at the annual October society dinner staged in Castle Douglas along with the sale, show and annual general meeting that has led to further opportunities for forging new business and friendship; understands that the cattle breed is presently experiencing an upsurge in popularity due to the fact it is one of the most visually distinctive breeds; recognises the many merits of the breed, including its unique appearance and good nature, as well as its ability to provide top quality beef; believes that this is largely down to the cattle originating in the harsh upland climate of the Galloway hills in beautiful south west Scotland; accepts that the "Beltie" is well-equipped to thrive outdoors in any climate, live far longer than other cattle, often well into their twenties, and produces more calves; welcomes the involvement of HRH Princess Alexandra, patron of the Belted Galloway Cattle Society, who recently attended the Wigtown Show at Bladnoch Park, Wigtown, where many fine examples of the "Beltie" were on display, as well as at both the Stewartry and Dumfries Agricultural Shows, and attracting huge interest and admiration from the general public, and wishes the society and its growing membership continued success in the coming year as it provides great hopes for Scotland's agricultural sector.

their behalf; further welcomes the shortlisting of the city of Glasgow, a UNESCO City of Music since 2008, as a possible host city; considers that the Scottish Event Campus in Glasgow Kelvin constituency to be the ideal venue in which to hold the contest; acknowledges the success of COP26, which was hosted there in 2022, and urges the public to support Glasgow and the Scottish Event Campus as the first choice for Eurovision 2023.

***[S6M-05666](#) Pam Gosal: Congratulating Doctor Mackenzie Green on Landing "dream job" at Vale of Leven Hospital**—That the Parliament congratulates Doctor Mackenzie Green on securing what he describes as his "dream job" at Vale of Leven Hospital in Alexandria; acknowledges that Mackenzie is originally from Yorkshire, but will now be settling in Scotland following the completion of his medicine course at the University of Glasgow; notes that Mackenzie is one of many junior doctors who have joined NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in recent weeks after officially qualifying, and wishes Mackenzie along with all the staff at Vale of Leven Hospital all the best for the future as they deliver high quality services to residents across the West of Scotland.
