*<u>S6M-02975</u> Keith Brown: Public Service Pensions and Judicial Offices Bill - UK Legislation—That the Scottish Parliament agrees that the relevant provisions of the Public Service Pensions and Judicial Offices Bill, introduced in the House of Lords on 19 July 2021 relating to enabling devolved judicial offices to be added to a judicial pension scheme at the request of the Scottish Ministers, the increase in the mandatory retirement age for devolved judicial office holders in Scotland to 75 and the addition of provisions on the determination and payment of allowances, so far as these matters fall within the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament or alter the executive competence of the Scottish Ministers, should be considered by the UK Parliament.

*<u>S6M-02921</u> Liam McArthur: Celebrating 33 Years of Craigies Butchers—That the Parliament notes with sadness that Craigie Butchers, a family-run wholesale butcher in Orkney, will be closing its doors at the end of this month after 33 years trading; understands that the wholesale butcher,

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based at the Hall of Yenstay in the east mainland of Orkney, which has been owned by the Craigie family for over 200 years, has grown to become one of the largest suppliers of premium-quality meat products in Orkney; highlights what it sees as the success of The Brig Larder, a conglomeration of Craigies Butchers with local fishmongers, Jollys of Orkney, run by George Stout, and a wine, beer and spirits purveyors, John Scott & Miller, jointly owned by Thorfinn and George, which was established in 2014 in Kirkwall; notes that Craigie Butchers have also scooped a number of prestigious local and national awards, including Best Meat Supplier/Best Producer at Orkney Food and Drink Awards in 2016, four gold awards at the Scottish Craft Butcher Awards in 2017 and Best Meat-Based Product at the Orkney Food and Drink Awards in 2018; understands that Craigies Butchers also pioneered the use of sustainably-managed Orkney goose, and has offered a popular selection of products using this healthy seasonal meat; commends Craigies Butchers for what it sees as their commitment to high-quality, locally-farmed and traceable Orkney beef, lamb and pork, and to supporting the local community by offering home-delivered meat packs during the COVID-19 pandemic; understands that Thorfinn has decided, after 33 years, that it is time for a new challenge; wishes Thorfinn and Katherine Craigie, as well as all the staff at Craigie Butchers, the very best for the future, and thanks them for their excellent service to the Orkney community.

*<u>S6M-02916</u> Liam Kerr: 100th Anniversary of the First Use of Insulin — That the Parliament notes the 100th anniversary of the first use of insulin on the 23 January 2022; understands that the discovery of insulin is seen as one of the greatest medical achievements of the 20th Century, and that John Macleod, one of three key scientists involved in the discovery, was from Aberdeen; notes what it sees as the important work still taking place 100 years later to help improve the lives

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of people who have diabetes, with Diabetes UK continuing to support scientists with their research, and hopes that this work can continue to find new life-changing discoveries.

*<u>S6M-02914</u> Martin Whitfield: Success of East Lothian's High Streets—That the Parliament notes the recent *Financial Times* analysis of data on how lockdowns and homeworking over the past two years have affected high streets across the UK; understands that the analysis found that the East Lothian local authority area has had the best performance in the UK, with shops reporting a 12% rise in in-person spending across the whole period, since March 2020; congratulates and thanks East Lothian's high-street retailers for this success and what it sees as the resilience and innovation they have shown throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, and further congratulates East Lothian residents for heeding the shop local message and for supporting local high streets and businesses over the last two years, and East Lothian Council for what it sees as the advice and support it has provided to businesses in the county before and during the pandemic, including the pioneering East Lothian Gift Card, which was launched in 2018.
