### Members' Business motions that have achieved cross party support

**\*[S6M-09705](#) Katy Clark: Fire Service Cuts**—That the Parliament notes, with concern, reports that the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) has ordered the temporary withdrawal of fire appliances at 10 stations across Scotland, including Greenock Community Fire Station in the West Scotland region; understands that the Fire Brigades Union has expressed deep concern that this reduction will risk the safety of both firefighters and the wider public; further understands that the SFRS is expected to receive a flat cash budget settlement from the Scottish Government over the next four years, and that the service claims it must make £36 million in cuts as a result; believes that this follows a decade of cuts, the reported loss of 1,100 firefighter jobs, and, it understands, a 14% increase in average response times per incident; notes SFRS Chief Officer Ross Haggart's comments that there is also a £630 million backlog in the service's capital investment; further notes reported freedom of information (FOI) findings that 75% of buildings in Scotland's fire estate are assessed as being of "bad" or "poor" suitability, and that around 45% are assessed as being in either "bad" or "poor" condition; believes that the combination of withdrawn appliances and what it sees as a dilapidated fire estate puts firefighters, who are exposed to health risks from encountering dangerous fire contaminants in their job, at further risk; further believes that firefighters work hard to ensure the safety of people in Scotland's communities; notes the view that firefighters deserve to be well-equipped, well-resourced, well-protected and well-paid to do the job that they do, and further notes calls for the Scottish Government to come forward with emergency funding for both day-to-day spend and capital budgets, in order to prevent further cuts to staff and equipment, and to modernise the fire estate.

**\*[S6M-09899](#) Liz Smith: Abercairny Estates Wins Estates Challenges Competition**—That the Parliament sends its congratulations to Abercairny Estates near Crieff on winning the Estates Challenges Competition held at the GWCT Scottish Game Fair 2023; notes that this is the first time that the popular event has taken place since 2019, following COVID-19 restrictions;

understands that representatives from each competing estate were required to demonstrate their skills in various activities, including shooting, fishing and gun dog handling; recognises that the challenges take place to raise awareness of the hard work of ghillies and gamekeepers to preserve the Scottish countryside, and applauds Abercairny Estates for taking the trophy with a masterly score of 274 points.

**\*[S6M-09898](#) Michelle Thomson: Stenhouse Performing Arts Selected to Compete at Dance World Cup 2023**—That the Parliament congratulates the dancers of Stenhouse Performing Arts on being selected to compete at the Dance World Cup 2023; understands that the competition was held in Braga, Portugal, between 30 June and 8 July; notes that, in order to qualify for the final of the Dance World Cup, dancers had to compete in a live qualifier event in Scotland; recognises that competitors from around the world competed at the Dance World Cup and, it understands, were judged by several esteemed judges; congratulates all the dancers from Stenhouse Performing Arts once more on being selected to represent Scotland at the Dance World Cup 2023, and wishes them well for future competitions.

**\*[S6M-09897](#) Emma Harper: ReDress the Brave Tartan Launched**—That the Parliament congratulates ReDress on registering the first-ever slow-fashion tartan, ReDress the Brave, with the Scottish Register of Tartans on 4 July 2023; notes that ReDress is a grassroots community interest company in Dumfries, which is run by volunteers and supported by local Scottish artisans; recognises that ReDress promotes ethical approaches to fashion design and that, thanks to its work, Dumfries is now known as a centre for slow fashion; understands that the tartan designer, Jonathan MacKinnon, created the tartan to highlight the importance of slow, sustainable, circular and regenerative approaches to textile and clothing production; further understands that the tartan's colours symbolise key elements of ReDress's work and reflects the Southern Uplands landscape of south west Scotland, which includes pink for the wild flowers and hillside heather, representing fashion and creativity, green for forest, coastal and upland landscapes, black for the shadows of hills and forests and to represent community, and yellow for the perfumed coastal gorse and a brighter future; concurs with the ReDress statement that ReDress the Brave is both traditional "but a bit punk", and wishes everyone at ReDress all the best as they promote an exciting approach to fashion that is healthier for both consumers and the environment.

**\*[S6M-09896](#) Pam Duncan-Glancy: Celebrating Glasgow North West Citizens Advice Bureau on its 40th Anniversary**—That the Parliament celebrates Glasgow North West Citizens Advice Bureau's 40th anniversary on 28 July 2023; appreciates all of the work that it does in supporting local citizens in north west Glasgow to access information and help them make informed decisions, free of charge, and supports Glasgow North West Citizens Advice Bureau as it continues to provide an invaluable service to those who need it.

**\*[S6M-09895](#) Pam Duncan-Glancy: Congratulating Nursing Team from Glasgow on Winning RCN Scotland Team of the Year**—That the Parliament congratulates the Glasgow-based nursing team from Stobhill Hospital on being named Scotland's Nursing Team of the Year at the Royal College of Nursing's Nurse of the Year Awards; recognises the key work that the team does in supporting people with drug and alcohol addiction; understands its ADRS Crisis Outreach Service in Glasgow city was established in 2021 to reduce the increasing number of nonfatal overdoses and drug-related deaths; appreciates the creative approach adopted by the nursing team to engage with vulnerable and high-risk individuals through focused outreach across Glasgow; understands that the team goes beyond its healthcare responsibilities, by providing practical and educational input to families, carers and a variety of support service staff to raise awareness of the impact of alcohol and substance use on a person's physical and mental health, as well as its

effects on wider social networks; recognises that the interventions of the nursing team include training on recognising and managing a drug overdose, providing naloxone and training on its use, and access to recovery or support services across Glasgow, and understands that the nursing team's inclusive approach has opened opportunities to link with a range of services to engage those that have been identified as high risk or in an alcohol or substance use crisis.

**\*S6M-09894 Kaukab Stewart: Vongayi Mufara Wins Trustee of the Year—**That the Parliament congratulates Vongayi Mufara of Amma Birth Companions on winning the Trustee of the Year award at the Scottish Council for Voluntary Organisations (SCVO) 2023 Scottish Charity Awards; understands that Vongayi first visited Amma Birth Companions in 2020 and was supported after the loss of one of her newborn twin sons; further understands that Vongayi joined the board of Amma Birth Companions as a service-user representative and, in 2022, was appointed Vice Chair; notes the valuable contribution of Vongayi to Amma Birth Companions' aims of providing care information and advocacy for women and birthing people who face birth and parenthood alone, including providing vital support to refugee and asylum-seeking women, survivors of human trafficking and other individuals experiencing multiple disadvantages; further notes that, as someone seeking asylum herself, Vongayi is not permitted to work, but has leveraged her background in finance, fundraising and campaigning to become a valued volunteer with several charitable organisations, including Amma Birth Companions, and commends Vongayi on winning Trustee of the Year at the SCVO 2023 Scottish Charity Awards.

**\*[S6M-09835 Kenneth Gibson: Holodomor of 1932-33, A Genocide of the Ukrainian People](#)**—That the Parliament recognises the Holodomor of 1932-33 in Ukraine as a genocide of the Ukrainian people; considers that the Holodomor, literally meaning extermination by hunger, was a deliberate campaign of starvation and violence carried out by the Soviet regime against the people of Ukraine, resulting in the deaths of millions; understands that Holodomor was part of Joseph Stalin's revolution from above which, from 1932 to 1933, inflicted a terror famine on the collectivised peasants of the Ukraine, Kuban and other areas of high Ukrainian ethnicity; notes that Stalin raised Ukraine's grain procurement quotas by 44%, which meant that there was not enough food to feed the peasants, as the law required that no grain from a collective farm could be given to members until the regime's quota had been met; understands that, due to the wall of secrecy imposed by the former Soviet Union, it is difficult to know how many perished during the Holodomor of 1932-33; notes, however, research suggesting that up to seven and a half million innocent people may have died as a direct result of the Soviet-imposed famine; understands that, during the height of the famine, international offers of aid and support were turned down by the regime, while vital food stores were allowed to rot in warehouses under armed guard; is aware that many members of the Ukrainian community in Scotland lost relatives during the Holodomor, and calls on the Russian Federation, as the primary successor of the Soviet Union, to apologise for perpetrating genocide on the Ukrainian people.

The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
