*<u>S6M-09941</u> Pauline McNeill: Glasgow's Night Bus Services—That the Parliament notes with concern the reported withdrawal of night bus services in Glasgow, as announced by First Bus on 10 July 2023; believes that a late night bus service is essential in the city to ensure that people relying on public transport can get home safely and affordably; further believes that reliability, accessibly and frequency of services is paramount to people finding the service easy to use; notes the support for the various campaigns to get Glasgow moving and Unite the Union's hospitality workers' campaign to make travel easy and safe for late night workers; further notes the view that research should be conducted to establish what level of service is needed in the city; considers that there is pubic support to have bus services publicly owned and operated, and notes the calls on First Bus, Strathclyde Partnership for Transport (SPT) and all bus operators to prioritise servicing passengers over increasing profits.

*S6M-09953 Sandesh Gulhane: Thales Glasgow Wins £169 Million Contract to Build Periscopes for the Royal Navy's Dreadnought Submarines—That the Parliament welcomes the news that periscope firm, Thales Glasgow, has won a £169 million contract to build periscopes for the UK's new Dreadnought class of nuclear deterrent submarine; understands that the contract, awarded by BAE Systems, will sustain more than 150 highly-skilled engineering and support jobs in Scotland, mainly at the Thales site in Govan, Glasgow; recognises that Thales Glasgow has a 106-year tradition of making periscopes for Royal Navy submarines, and that every Royal Navy submarine since 1917 has carried a Thales periscope or optronics mast made on the River Clyde; welcomes that Thales Glasgow's workforce will be at the forefront of producing state-of-the-art multi-sensor combat system masts, also known as the "above water eyes", for the new Dreadnought-class submarines, which, it understands, are being built to replace the Vanguardclass vessels currently in service, and considers that the contract will create highly-skilled jobs, boost the economy and showcase engineering skills and innovation in Scotland.

*<u>S6M-09943</u> Pauline McNeill: Palestinian Children in Israel Military Detention—That the Parliament notes with concern new research from Save the Children that reports that Palestinian children in the Israel military detention system face physical and emotional abuse with, it understands, four out of five of them being beaten, 69% being strip-searched, and nearly half being injured at the point of arrest, including gunshot wounds and broken bones, while there are also reports of sexual violence and some children being transferred to court or between detention centres in small cages; understands that the research also showed how children's care and hope for the future dramatically decreased from 96% in 2020 to 68% in 2023; believes that there is no justification for beating and stripping children and that, based on the reported evidence from Save the Children reported view that these practices are a major and longstanding human rights concern, and supports its calls for the government of Israel to end the detention of Palestinian children under military law and their prosecution in military courts.

Proposals for Members' Bills

A member seeking to introduce a Member's Bill must first lodge a draft proposal, together with a consultation document (or a statement of reasons why consultation is not considered necessary). Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no statement is made that the Scottish Government is planning equivalent legislation.
