***[S6M-09980](#) Paul Sweeney: Funding for Glasgow's World-leading Cultural Attractions—**That the Parliament congratulates Glasgow Life and The Burrell Collection, which was gifted to Glasgow by the late shipping magnate, William Burrell, on winning the Art Fund Museum of the Year 2023; notes that the six-year refurbishment and redisplay of one of Scotland's largest art collections was regarded by the judges as world-class; considers that the potential loss of 37 of 128 posts within Glasgow Life would degrade the quality and potential of Glasgow's 10 museums and art galleries; believes that Glasgow Life's reported proposal to cut these jobs would be detrimental to the ability of the organisation to undertake world-leading exhibition and renovation programmes; recognises that a number of culturally significant attractions in the city, such as the People's Palace and Winter Gardens at Glasgow Green, have reportedly been unable to secure the necessary capital investment to remain fully operational in recent years, and notes the calls on the Scottish Government to recognise the national and global importance of Glasgow's museums and art galleries by providing direct national funding for their operation and upkeep on a similar basis to that of top Edinburgh attractions.

***[S6M-09975](#) Bob Doris: 75 Years of Marie Curie—**That the Parliament congratulates Marie Curie on its 75th anniversary; recognises that, since its inception in 1948, Marie Curie has provided palliative and end of life care and support to millions of people affected by terminal illness and those dealing with dying, death, and bereavement across the UK; understands that Marie Curie works closely with NHS Scotland and is the largest provider of palliative care services for adults outside the NHS; believes that access to appropriate palliative care services is a key element of ensuring the best possible end of life experience; welcomes what it sees as the invaluable contribution of the Marie Curie nursing and volunteer services and its two hospices in Edinburgh and Glasgow; commends its most recent report, *How Many People Need Palliative Care?*, which was published on 6 July 2023 and maps palliative care need across the UK into the late 2040s; understands that, according to the report, palliative care need will increase by more than 25% across the UK by 2048; notes its prediction that the number of 85 year olds living in Scotland will increase by 90% by 2048 to 257,000; considers that, while welcome, this presents a challenge to palliative care services as the number of people with comorbidities in need of complex person-centred care and pain management at the end of life will also increase;

***[S6M-10006](#) Alexander Stewart: Carron Valley Community Woodland Commended in Scotland's Finest Woods Awards for 2023**—That the Parliament congratulates Carron Valley Community Woodland on being "commended" in the Large Community Woodland Group competition within Scotland's Finest Woods Awards for 2023; understands that the Carron Valley and District Community took ownership of 52 acres, or 21 hectares, of woodland to the east of the Carron Valley reservoir, known as the Carron Valley Community Woodland, in 2018; believes that since that time, and along with the support of expert professionals, they have developed an ecologically responsible community asset that benefits nature, residents and visitors alike; understands that, through this work, in excess of 9,000 native trees have been planted, new paths have been created, and volunteer activities, social events, and biodiversity and conservation projects have taken place with the aim of providing immediate and long-term benefits, for both nature and for people, and congratulates all involved on their significant endeavours for the community.

***[S6M-10005](#) Alexander Stewart: Scotland's Finest Woods Award for Doune Community Woodland Group, Doune Ponds**—That the Parliament congratulates Doune Community Woodland Group on Doune Ponds, after it won the Small Community Woodland Group category in Scotland's Finest Woods Awards for 2023; understands that, since the group took over the project in 2014, the ponds, which were previously described as unloved, have been transformed by the diligence and commitment of all the volunteers involved; considers that they have also been recognised a number of times and that the ponds are now considered as a wonderful asset for the whole community; acknowledges that Doune Ponds were the winners of Scotland's Finest Woods Awards in the Community Woodland category in 2017, and that they were shortlisted for the RSPB Nature of Scotland Award and came "highly commended" in Scotland's Finest Woods Awards in 2019; notes that the majority of work carried out at the ponds is by a group of dedicated volunteers, who have committed time and energy to making Doune Ponds what it is today; understands that the group meets every Wednesday morning to carry out all manner of maintenance tasks as well as major projects and that it also runs community weekend volunteering sessions for anyone who would like to attend, and commends everyone involved for their tireless work and dedication in this regard.

***S6M-10002 David Torrance: Ben Sandilands Wins T20 1500m Para Athletics World Crown in Record Time**—That the Parliament applauds Ben Sandilands, of Kirkcaldy, who won a gold medal in the T20 1500m Para Athletics World Championship race in Paris on 17 July 2023; understands that Ben, who was fifth with just 200m remaining, produced a blistering finish to take the honours in 3:52.42, breaking his own European record and setting a new championship record; recognises that Ben was part of a trio of Fife athletes, all coached by Steve Doig, who contested the final, with Fife AC's Owen Miller finishing seventh in 3:58.22 and Steven Bryce, a member of Victoria Park City of Glasgow Athletics Club, coming 13th in 4:03.80; notes that Ben is targeting an appearance at T20s most prestigious event, the Paralympics, with the next staging due to be held in Paris from 28 August to 8 September 2024; celebrates Ben's drive and determination to become the best athlete he can be, and wishes him all the best in his ambition to reach the Paralympics, as well as all other events he competes in.

were issued via PayPoint or Post Office vouchers, and that the money was sent directly to suppliers for those with credit meters; is aware that the fund was supported directly from Community Windpower's onshore wind farm near Dalry and follows a similar scheme in East Lothian, where £1 million helped over 1,400 vulnerable families and individuals; welcomes that Community Windpower's total community offering throughout Scotland has now, it understands, reached over £8 million; recognises that the Dalry Parish Boundary Trust was set up in 2014 and has since supported numerous organisations, schools, youth and sports organisations, as well as individuals, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic; appreciates that John Smith, secretary of the Trust, said that when the energy and food crisis raised its head, they decided to look at what and who they could help in the town, and wishes everyone in the Dalry Parish Boundary trust and Community Windpower every success in their future endeavours.
