***[S6M-08273](#) Foysoil Choudhury: Congratulating Living Memory Association**—That the Parliament congratulates the Living Memory Association on recently being awarded a grant of £108,184 from the National Lottery Heritage Fund; understands that the association has been awarded funding for its exhibition, *Away for the Messages – Memories of Shopping and Shops*; believes that the exhibition aims to capture and document memories of shopping in Edinburgh communities; understands that this project will create an interactive exhibition within a traditional shopping unit; commends all the hard work of the Living Memory Association; recognises what it sees as a very well deserved grant, and wishes everyone at the Living Memory Association and all those involved in the project all the best for the future.

***[S6M-08272](#) Paul O’Kane: Diabetes Tech Can’t Wait Campaign**—That the Parliament celebrates the launch of Diabetes Scotland’s campaign, Diabetes Tech Can’t Wait; considers that Scotland has led the way in advances in diabetes care and technology, from John J R Macleod jointly winning the Nobel Prize in 1923 for discovering insulin, through to the development of the insulin pen by a team led by Dr Sheila Reith, in the early 1980s; understands that the Diabetes Tech Can’t Wait campaign seeks to build on the progress of the £14.6 million that the Scottish Government, following recommendations by the Scottish Health Technologies Group, provided to NHS boards to support the roll-out of the hybrid closed loop, often called the "artificial pancreas", technologies across Scotland; believes that technology is essential to providing life-changing support to help people manage diabetes through using wearable technology such as pumps, continuous glucose monitoring, flash glucose monitoring, and hybrid closed loop systems, transforming the lives of people with diabetes and helping to ensure that people avoid life-changing complications; considers that there are too many people in Scotland who cannot yet access diabetes technology and whose lives would be markedly improved if they had access to the appropriate technology to improve the management of their condition, and commits to the expansion of access to diabetes technology to ensure that every person with diabetes has access to the most appropriate form of technology to best manage their condition and improve their quality of life.

cragfast climbers on Ben Nevis, on 14 March 2023, by the Lochaber Mountain Rescue Team and the Inverness-based Coastguard helicopter; further notes that this was carried out in the dark and has been reported to have been a particularly challenging rescue, requiring great skill by both the mountain rescue team and the helicopter crew; recognises that each year sees many such rescues where local mountain rescue teams and coastguard helicopter crews work together to save lives on Scotland's mountains, and strongly commends the skill and dedication of Scotland's volunteer mountain rescue teams and the search and rescue helicopter crews for their role in saving lives.

***[S6M-08270](#) Fulton MacGregor: Coatbridge St Patrick's Day Festival 2023**—That the Parliament recognises the celebration of St Patrick's Day on 17 March; understands that 2023's theme is "one", encouraging people from all over the world to connect, participate and to celebrate together as one; notes Coatbridge's long-standing place as a home for the Irish diaspora in Scotland, with over double the amount of Irish-born residents compared to the rest of Scotland, and with the 1851 census registering 36% of the town's population as being Irish born; congratulates the organising committee of this year's St Patrick's day festival in Coatbridge; acknowledges that it is the first in-person celebration of the event to be held in four years; understands that the festival programme includes music, ceilidhs, food, drink, and more entertainment; wishes the festival continued success into the future; acknowledges the close links that Scotland has had with its Irish neighbours in the previous millennia, and wishes continued close Dalradian links and friendship for millennia to come.

***[S6M-08266](#) Fulton MacGregor: Baby Loss Memorial Book**—That the Parliament understands that the loss of a baby at any stage is an unimaginable tragedy; praises the recent announcement by the First Minister that a Memorial Book for those who have experienced a pregnancy or baby loss prior to 24 weeks will be made available this summer; notes that successful applications will receive an entry in the memorial book and a certificate; recognises the importance of making this process as easy as possible by ensuring that the process will be free of charge, that all information given is voluntary, and that no medical evidence will be required in making an application; acknowledges the great work done by the Coatbridge-based charity, Baby Loss Retreat, which was founded in February 2018 by Julie and Bryan Morrison; praises the charity for its diligent efforts to support parents and families who have been affected by miscarriage, stillbirth and neonatal death; understands that some examples of how the charity offers solace and comfort to grieving families include regular peer support meetings, coffee mornings, memorial services, and therapy sessions, and remembers all those across Scotland who have lost a baby at any stage of development.
