#### Members' Business motions that have not achieved cross party support

\*S6M-12605 Bill Kidd: 50th Anniversary of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974—
That the Parliament marks the 50th anniversary of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, which, to this day, remains the umbrella legislation that underpins all legal health, safety and welfare requirements for both employers and employees in the UK, including in the Glasgow Anniesland constituency; acknowledges the effect that this legislation has had on workplace safety through the laying down of wide-ranging duties on employers to protect the health, safety and welfare at work of all of their employees, as well as others on their premises, including temporary or casual workers, self-employed workers, clients, visitors and the general public; understands that, despite remaining too high, fatal injuries to employees fell by 73%, while reported non-fatal injuries dropped by 70%, between 1974 and 2007, and notes the belief that, in light of this milestone, it is time for all relevant stakeholders to come together to examine what steps need to be taken now to ensure that employment law continues to deliver for Scotland's workers for the next 50 years.

\*S6M-12559 Alex Rowley: Physiotherapy Workforce Shortage in Scotland—That the Parliament is concerned about the reported shortage of physiotherapists in the NHS workforce in Scotland and notes the Chartered Society of Physiotherapy's campaign "Scotland needs more physios"; notes the belief that Scotland does not currently educate or train enough physiotherapists to supply the workforce needs, with, it understands, only 7% of the hundreds of university applicants accepted onto undergraduate physiotherapy training places, and that this leaves considerable scope to expand the supply of qualified physiotherapists; understands that undergraduate training places have doubled in England to meet demand, but that there has been no increase in Scotland in the last decade, meaning that, while Scottish course programmes are oversubscribed with applicants, not enough places are funded to meet the needs of Scotland's NHS; acknowledges the reported views of physiotherapists, stating that they are finding it extremely difficult to recruit staff for their practices across Scotland, with record high vacancy rates, averaging over 10%, and that this is having an impact on existing staff morale, with increased levels of stress and work pressures; believes that the shortage of physiotherapists impacts on local communities, their services and staff, including in Mid Scotland and Fife, and

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further believes that physiotherapy is essential to reduce hospital admissions, speed up discharge from hospital and reduce reliance on social care, all of which are critical.

\*S6M-12593 Claire Baker: Raith Rovers' Lewis Vaughan Awarded Testimonial Match—That the Parliament recognises that Lewis Vaughan, of Raith Rovers, played his testimonial match against Hibernian FC on 20 March 2024; understands that clubs normally grant a testimonial game after 10 years of service to the club; recognises what it sees as the incredible resilience shown by Lewis, as he recovered from four separate, potentially career-ending injuries to his anterior cruciate ligaments, to become one of the club's most successful and celebrated players; believes that, after signing for Raith Rovers' youth teams in 2008, Vaughan has spent 13 years in the senior side, punctuated only by a short, successful spell on loan at Dumbarton FC; understands that, according to the club, Vaughan has made 247 appearances, scoring 86 goals, including a famous hat-trick against derby rivals, Dunfermline, in January 2019, which has helped make him the record goal scorer in that fixture; recognises that his goal-scoring exploits have put him in the club's top 20 all-time scorers at the age of only 28; believes that his goals, assists and leadership have inspired Raith Rovers to a title challenge in the Scottish Championship season

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2023-24; thanks Hibernian FC for taking its time to honour the player's contributions, and wishes Lewis Vaughan the very best for the rest of the season and his future career.

\*S6M-12591 Jackson Carlaw: Kirkhill Primary School Receives Impressive Education Scotland Report—That the Parliament congratulates Kirkhill Primary School, in Newton Mearns, on receiving what it sees as an impressive inspection report from Education Scotland; notes that, in December 2023, staff from Education Scotland were present at Kirkhill to conduct an inspection of the school, and that conversations with parents, carers and pupils formed part of the assessment, alongside close working with the head teacher and staff; recognises that, on the quality indicators of learning, teaching and assessment and raising attainment and achievement, Kirkhill Primary School was rated as very good; acknowledges that a range of strengths in the work of the school were identified through the inspection, including articulate and confident children who are very motivated and engaged with learning and enjoy passing on their knowledge to others, and strong leadership and direction from the head teacher at Kirkhill, where a close working relationship with all staff has been established, leading to a nurturing and inclusive school culture, which supports the high levels of attainment and achievement from pupils; further acknowledges that the inspection also established, as strengths of Kirkhill, the school's skill-based learning approach to science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), and teachers making very good use of their knowledge and skills to support and enhance learning across the curriculum and secure positive outcomes for all pupils; commends staff and pupils at Kirkhill Primary for achieving what it considers to be a very strong inspection report from Education Scotland, and believes that the school is a credit to Newton Mearns and wider East Renfrewshire.
