**S6M-17754 Miles Briggs: A720 Sheriffhall Roundabout**—That the Parliament notes with concern the reported ongoing delay to progress towards a new grade separated junction on the A720 Edinburgh City Bypass at Sheriffhall: understands that a public local inquiry was carried out in early 2023, with results reviewed by an independent reporter and delivered to the Scottish Government in early 2024; further understands that the report has been under active consideration by the Scottish Ministers for over a year; believes that motorists using the Edinburgh City Bypass have been subjected to hours of unnecessary congestion due to delays in delivering the A720 Sheriffhall roundabout, since funding was committed in 2018 as part of the Edinburgh and South East Scotland City Region Deal; notes the calls for the Scottish Ministers to prioritise what it sees as this crucial infrastructure project, which, it understands, motorists in the south east of Scotland have been waiting seven years for; understands that the upgrade was originally priced at £120 million; notes the calls on ministers to urgently update the Parliament on the full details of any additional costs for the development of the junction due to the length of time that it has taken to progress it, and further notes the view that it is strategically important to make the improvements on the A720 Edinburgh City Bypass at Sheriffhall, to help deliver improvements to infrastructure that will support local and national economic growth.

\*<u>S6M-17869</u> Jackie Baillie: Addressing Scotland's Medical and Nursing Workforce Crisis— That the Parliament recognises the scale of the crisis in Scotland's NHS, with almost one in six people in Scotland on NHS waiting lists for tests or treatment, and private hospital admissions in Scotland reaching record levels in 2024, all while patients struggle to access a GP appointment; is concerned, therefore, regarding reports that resident doctors are unable to secure speciality training places in Scotland's NHS, while newly qualified nurses cannot get jobs despite over 2,600 unfilled whole-time equivalent nursing and midwifery vacancies; regrets that inadequate NHS workforce planning by the Scottish National Party administration is forcing highly skilled clinicians to seek employment elsewhere, and calls on the Scottish Government to expedite its reported Future Medical Workforce project, and to report back to the Parliament by 1 September 2025, and undertake a wider review of workforce planning, with independent modelling and projections, and to report back by 1 December 2025, so that there is the required level of workforce to staff Scotland's NHS.

\*<u>S6M-17870</u> Alex Cole-Hamilton: Congratulations to Pregnancy Counselling and Care (Scotland) on SCVO Charity Awards Nomination—That the Parliament congratulates Pregnancy Counselling and Care (Scotland) on being shortlisted for Partnership of the Year at the 2025 Scottish Council for Voluntary Organisations (SCVO) Scottish Charity Awards; notes that the nomination recognises the organisation's impactful collaboration with the Gyle Shopping Centre in support of what it sees as its vital Baby Bank service; commends the charity's nearly 50 years of dedicated service in Edinburgh and the Lothians, offering practical and emotional support to individuals and families affected by pregnancy, baby loss, and early parenthood; acknowledges its provision of Baby Packs to families in need, and its specialist, free perinatal counselling for those facing grief, trauma, and mental health challenges; recognises that, in the past year alone, the charity supported over 560 families, many of whom were experiencing poverty, homelessness, or social isolation, and wishes Pregnancy Counselling and Care (Scotland) continued success in what it sees as its compassionate and essential work.

\*<u>S6M-17868</u> Mercedes Villalba: Protecting Community Access to Swimming Facilities in Dundee and Angus—That the Parliament notes the ongoing review by Dundee and Angus College regarding the potential closure of the swimming pool at its Gardyne Campus, reportedly due to the age of the facility and high operational costs; considers that the 25-metre pool is a valued community resource, used by college students, local swimming clubs, and the wider public, for both recreational and competitive purposes; notes that this proposal comes at a time when access to swimming facilities in Dundee is already under pressure, with plans to close several school pools also under consideration; acknowledges the critical role that swimming pools play in supporting public health, physical activity, water safety, and inclusive access to sport; highlights what it sees as the growing national crisis in pool provision; calls for urgent action to protect these essential facilities, and urges Dundee and Angus College, the Scottish Government, and all relevant partners to work together to find sustainable solutions that will ensure the continued operation of the Gardyne Campus swimming pool and safeguard access for future generations.

\*<u>S6M-17867</u> Monica Lennon: Opportunities to Improve the Mental Health of Infants in Foster and Kinship Care—That the Parliament welcomes the publication of the Best Services Trial (BeST?) findings in *Nature Medicine* on 1 May 2025, which was a randomised control trial led by Professor Helen Minnis at the University of Glasgow and run in partnership with the National Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children (NSPCC) that looked at improving the mental health of children up to five years old in foster and kinship care; understands that this study, funded by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), the largest of its kind, compared the impact of an infant mental health service delivered by a multidisciplinary team, known as the New Orleans Intervention Model, with that of the social work care and support families usually receive; further understands that, although the study found limited impact of the intervention itself, it revealed several aspects of the Scottish care system that could be impacting babies and young children's mental health; understands that the study found that the rate of children getting into a permanent placement in England, where a judge oversees the process, was nearly four and a half times faster compared to Scotland, and that the long timescales in Scotland

also impacted costs; supports the researcher's calls for authoritative and consistent oversight of a child's journey through Scotland's care system, encouraging strict adherence to court-mandated timescales, balancing time for the birth family to access relationship-focused, therapeutic support with making timely decisions about the young child's future; calls for infant-parent relationship teams to become an integral part of social and legal systems, and believes that the current review of the Children's Hearing System and the forthcoming Promise Bill present incomparable opportunities to embed BeST? learning to transform the social care and legal system to uphold the distinct needs and rights of babies in, and around, the care system in Scotland.

\*<u>S6M-17866</u> Kevin Stewart: Congratulations to Aberdeen Science Centre—That the Parliament congratulates Aberdeen Science Centre on winning funding from the ScottishPower Foundation for its Playlist Power project; understands that the award of over £52,000 will be used to achieve the Aberdeen Science Centre's aims of inspiring the next generation and increasing their knowledge and understanding of sustainability and carbon emissions through a series of fun and innovative activities; notes that the Playlist Power project will bring the Aberdeen Science Centre's Sustainable Superstars Roadshow to 35 local community events across the north east of Scotland, starting in May 2025, including, it understands, at least five events in high-priority communities, within the top 20% most deprived neighbourhoods in Scotland; understands that this funding is part of £1.2 million that the ScottishPower Foundation has awarded to organisations across Scotland in 2025, helping projects that seek to bring positive change in communities that need it the most, and wishes the Aberdeen Science Centre's team of public engagement specialists well in the delivery of their programme.
