*<u>S6M-18044</u> Kevin Stewart: Port of Aberdeen Shore Power Infrastructure Leading the Way— That the Parliament welcomes the news that Port of Aberdeen's shore power infrastructure is now live, having seen the first vessel, OSM Thome's NS Iona, connecting to the new system; notes that this system, which allows vessels to plug directly into power from the port's renewable energy tariff, instead of running on their own fossil fuel auxiliary engines while at berth, is Scotland's largest marine decarbonisation project, and can provide power for eight vessels at the port's north harbour; understands that this infrastructure, installed by PowerCon as part of the "Shore Power in Operation" demonstrator, is part of a £4 million investment in new clean energy infrastructure, and is hoped to cut up to 60,000 tonnes of CO2 equivalent over the next 20 years, the same as removing 2,140 cars from the road every year; believes that this project shows Port of Aberdeen to be leading the rest of the UK by example in adopting this shore connection technology, displaying its commitment to renewable and sustainable solutions, and wishes the CEO, Bob Sanguinetti, and the rest of the Port of Aberdeen team well in their plans to expand this infrastructure at more berths throughout its 7,600m quayside.

*S6M-18043 Bob Doris: The Scottish Ambulance Service and Macmillan Palliative and End of Life Care Project—That the Parliament commends all those involved in delivering the Macmillan Palliative and End of Life Care Project, a successful partnership between the Scottish Ambulance Service and Macmillan Cancer Support; understands that the project sought to provide the required skills and training to ambulance professionals to best support those requiring palliative and end of life care, including the development and delivery of 29 alternative care pathways to ensure that the most appropriate support is offered to patients, seeing a significant reduction in unscheduled and unnecessary hospital admissions; acknowledges that around one in five emergency calls in 2023 related to patients with palliative care needs, and that many were needlessly being admitted to an acute setting; understands that the project enabled an increased number of patients to remain in their own homes, 80% in 2024 compared with 30% in 2019 before the project started; further understands that 88% of carers rated the care offered by Scottish Ambulance Service clinicians as either excellent or good, and that there was a clear increase in individuals experiencing care that is timely, clinically effective, respectful, and aligns with preferences; notes that the project received the Top Team award at the Scottish Health Awards 2024, in recognition of the positive impact that the partnership has demonstrated, and hopes that resource can be identified to roll out, embed and further develop this enhanced service for all those requiring palliative and end of life care.

The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 4.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
