*S6M-19487 Bob Doris: Financial Considerations When Leaving an Abusive Relationship—That the Parliament notes the Social Justice and Social Security Committee's 6th Report, 2025 (Session 6), *Inquiry Into Financial Considerations When Leaving an Abusive Relationship* (SP Paper 849).

Other new and altered motions and amendments

*S6M-19500 Alexander Stewart: Asda Reintroduces its Winter Warmer Café Initiative for the Over-60s—That the Parliament welcomes the news that Asda is reintroducing its £1 Winter Warmer café initiative to support people aged 60 and over during the colder months; understands that, from 1 November 2025 to end of February 2026, the offer includes soup, with a choice of tomato or chicken, bread and unlimited tea or coffee for just £1, and is available in all 212 Asda cafés nationwide, including in the Mid-Scotland and Fife region; believes that this initiative is designed to provide nutritious and affordable meals and a welcoming space for social interaction, recognising the financial and emotional pressures that many older people face during winter; acknowledges that recent insights from Asda's Christmas community tracker have revealed that one in 10 older people were unsure if they would speak to anyone between 15 December and 1 January, and one in 10 over 60s visited a supermarket simply to speak to someone; considers that this finding highlights what it sees as the critical role that supermarkets can play in supporting social wellbeing; notes that the £1 Winter Warmer initiative not only addresses food insecurity but also provides a safe, welcoming environment for older people who may otherwise feel isolated during the colder months; acknowledges that in 2024, Asda served over 500,000 Winter Warmer meals across the United Kingdom, which, it believes, demonstrates the scale and importance of the initiative; considers that the offer provides immediate relief to those on fixed incomes, helping them stay warm and nourished, and commends Asda and its community champions, who are actively engaging with local over-60s groups to encourage participation and reduce social isolation.

*S6M-19499 Liam Kerr: Port of Aberdeen Sets New Cruise Passenger Records—That the Parliament congratulates the Port of Aberdeen on welcoming a record 43,000 cruise passengers in 2025, which is a 79% increase on the previous year; believes that this achievement establishes Aberdeen as one of the UK's fastest-growing cruise destinations, with over 65 vessel calls during the season; notes the key role of the new South Harbour in enabling this growth by accommodating larger liners; recognises what it sees as the significant economic benefits to the north east region, including

*S6M-19498 Clare Adamson: From Scotland with Love, the Christine Wittcitt Story —That the Parliament remembers Christine Wittcitt, from Wishaw, who sadly lost her life in Sarajevo while delivering humanitarian aid in the 1990s; notes that Christine was a school teacher in Wishaw until 1993 when she and her husband, Allan volunteered to work with Edinburgh Direct Aid, which was founded in 1992 by Dr Denis Rutovitz MBE and Professor Jeanne Bell; recognises that Christine's bravery, compassion and sacrifice are recognised in a new book. From Scotland with Love, by Fred Brigland, which is dedicated to the many people who chose compassion, humanity and bravery over conflict; notes that the book highlights how ordinary Scots risked their lives to help others; commends Fred on telling the story of the courage of these ordinary Scots who chose to show humanity, and notes that all proceeds will go to ongoing humanitarian initiatives, with the aim of ensuring that the legacy of Christine, and the other volunteers, continues.

*S6M-19495 Emma Harper: Celebrating Befriending Week 2025—That the Parliament recognises Befriending Week 2025, which takes place from 1 to 7 November and is a national campaign celebrating and raising awareness of befriending and its positive impact on individuals and communities across Scotland; notes that Befriending Week was established in 2012 by Befriending Networks and has grown year on year through collaboration with its membership, with events and activities taking place nationwide; acknowledges that the theme for 2025 is Collaboration and Partnership, highlighting the vital role befriending plays in tackling isolation, reducing loneliness and fostering meaningful social connections; commends the 104 Scottish member organisations of Befriending Networks and the thousands of volunteer befrienders who give their time to support people of all ages; congratulates the 21 Scottish organisations that have achieved the Quality in Befriending Award and the 10 that hold this award at excellence level, which include the Dumfries and Galloway Befriending Project in South Scotland; recognises the contribution of over 1.6 million volunteer befriending hours annually across the UK and the more than 21,000 active befriending matches facilitated by Befriending Networks; expresses concern at the increasing strain on the sector, with 72% of services reporting rising demand and an estimated 7,400 people currently waiting to be
