*S6M-19280 Nicola Sturgeon: Scotland's Commitment to Global Climate Justice and Fair Climate Finance—That the Parliament notes that Glasgow hosted the UN Climate Change Conference (COP26) in 2021, which it considers built momentum for the establishment of the historic Loss and Damage Fund; understands that Scotland became the first nation to contribute to this fund with an initial £2 million pledge, demonstrating, it believes, Scotland's leadership in climate justice; considers that climate change disproportionately affects the world's most vulnerable communities that have contributed the least to the problem; believes that addressing climate impacts requires transformative fiscal reform and international cooperation to tackle economic and environmental inequalities; notes the view that industrialised countries and historic emitters, including Scotland and the UK, must meet their fair share of international climate finance, which it understands is estimated globally to be between £7.6 billion and £33 billion annually; further notes what it sees as Scotland's ongoing commitment to championing climate justice and building on Glasgow's COP26 legacy and the precedent set by Scotland's Loss and Damage Fund contributions throughout the current parliamentary session, and notes the support for continued advocacy for these principles in international fora and within climate and development strategies.

*S6M-19290 Kevin Stewart: Research Funding for DIOKA Therapeutics —That the Parliament welcomes the news that DIOKA Therapeutics, which is a University of Aberdeen pre-spinout company, has been awarded £125,000 by the Scottish Funding Council to develop a new way of treating high blood pressure; notes that high blood pressure, which is also called hypertension, is the leading cause of early death worldwide, and that current treatments are not always effective; understands that this new treatment is based on research by a team led by Dr Guy Bewick, who is the Senior Lecturer in Neurosciences at the University and the Chief Scientific Officer at DIOKA; notes that the team has identified sensors in the body that monitor blood pressure, and seeks to use these to take advantage of the body's natural blood pressure regulatory circuit; believes that, if the development of this new type of drug is successful, it could revolutionise treatment for hypertension, and wishes the team at DIOKA all the best in taking this work to the next stage.

*S6M-19288 Kevin Stewart: Aberdeen Royal Infirmary HIV and Hepatitis Testing First—That the Parliament welcomes the news that patients treated in Accident and Emergency (A&E) in Aberdeen will be the first in Scotland to be routinely offered tests for HIV as well as hepatitis B and C; notes that the initiative follows a successful three-month trial at Aberdeen Royal Infirmary in 2024, which was funded by the Scottish Government, where around 4,500 people were tested and one-in-180 was found to carry previously undiagnosed blood-borne viruses, which was a higher prevalence than was expected; understands that the tests will be carried out on people who already need a blood test anyway, with the option to opt-out, resulting in no additional time spent in the emergency department or increased waits for patients; further understands that this initiative will be funded by the Scottish Government until the end of March 2027, when it will be reviewed; believes that early diagnosis of blood-borne viruses will reduce transmission rates and improve clinical outcomes for those affected, and hopes that this initiative, which will be rolled out in the Lothian and Glasgow areas by March 2026, will aid the Scottish Government's drive to eliminate hepatitis C, end new transmissions of HIV and offer treatment to people living with hepatitis B.
