**\*S7M-00351 Willie Rennie: The People's Emergency Briefing Screenings**—That the Parliament notes the screenings of *The People's Emergency Briefing*, which are being held across Scotland, which set out what it believes are the escalating risks posed by climate change and nature loss; further notes the expert evidence presented, which suggests that the UK faces intensifying weather extremes, with up to one in four properties at risk of flooding by 2050 and increasing heatwaves and wildfires; believes that current global trajectories risk 3 to 4°C of warming, threatening systemic societal disruption and exceeding the UK's fair share of the remaining carbon budget within years; understands with concern that the UK ranks among the lowest globally for biodiversity, with significant declines in wildlife and ecosystem health; acknowledges warnings that food security, public health and national security are increasingly compromised by climate-related impacts, including supply shocks, economic instability and heightened global tensions; notes what it sees as the substantial economic costs of inaction, compared with the benefits of rapid transition to a low-carbon economy; calls on the UK Government to screen a prime-time televised showing of the film across all the main television channels, delivered by independent experts and supported by the UK's Chief Scientific Adviser, setting out the reported nature and scale of the climate and nature threats facing the UK and why these threats matter to people's lives and livelihoods, and calls for the UK and Scottish governments to urgently deliver the necessary legislation, investment and public engagement that is commensurate with the scale and urgency of the crisis.

**\*[S7M-00312 Finlay Carson: Congratulations to Suzy Rook on Historic Arctic Swim and Inspiring Fundraising Efforts](#)**—That the Parliament congratulates Suzy Rook, a former Scottish international rugby player, on her extraordinary and historic achievement in becoming the first Scottish person to swim one kilometre in the Arctic Ocean; recognises that she completed this remarkable endurance challenge in sub-minus 4C temperatures without a wetsuit, relying only on a standard swimming costume and goggles, and doing so on her birthday, demonstrating what it believes to be exceptional courage, resilience and determination; acknowledges her distinguished sporting career, in

which she earned 13 caps for the Scotland Women's National Rugby Team, between 2011 and 2013, as a front-row forward, a British Nomads cap against South Africa and represented clubs including Kirkcaldy, Dundee Morgan, Murrayfield Wanderers and Stewartry, with notable highlights including playing at Twickenham and Murrayfield; commends her for undertaking this Arctic challenge following her recovery from thyroid cancer and for using her experience to inspire others and raise vital funds for causes close to her heart, namely Back Onside, which provides crucial mental health support, particularly in rural communities, and the Butterfly Thyroid Cancer Trust, which supports those affected by thyroid cancer; recognises her ongoing contribution to her local community in Dumfries and Galloway as a justice social worker, a co-founder of the Crossmichael Swim Queens and through her work with the Loch Ken Trust; applauds all those who have supported her fundraising efforts; celebrates the awareness she has raised for mental health and cancer support, and wishes Suzy every success in her continued work, both in her community and as an inspirational advocate for resilience, recovery and charitable endeavour.
