***[S7M-00413](#) Jackie Dunbar: Northfield Academy Celebrates 70 Years**—That the Parliament celebrates the 70th anniversary of Northfield Academy; understands that the Aberdeen Donside-based school, which opened in 1956, currently serves the communities of Northfield, Cummings Park, Middlefield, Marchburn, Heathryfold, Byron and Mastrick; notes that the school was initially built to accommodate 850 pupils, however, during the 1960s and 1970s, its roll exceeded this with a peak of 1,562 attending, meaning that additional facilities had to be built on the campus; understands that, during the 1980s, it was one of four secondaries in the area that faced the threat of closure, alongside Hilton, Linksfield and Summerhill academies, with the three schools closing between 1988 and 2002 and merging with Northfield and St Machar academies; notes that it held a celebration event on 13 June 2026 for the communities that the school serves, as well as extending the invitation to all former pupils, with activities for all ages to get involved in throughout the day; recognises the efforts of Katie Andrews, the School Support Services Manager, for all her hard work and efforts in organising what it believes was a fantastic day for the community to celebrate the significant milestone, and wishes all staff and pupils at Northfield Academy every success for the future.

***[S7M-00412](#) Jackie Dunbar: SAMH Launches The Nook in Aberdeen**—That the Parliament welcomes the opening of The Nook, in Aberdeen, by SAMH on 17 June 2026; understands that The Nook, which is located at Marischal Square, will provide accessible, drop-in mental health and wellbeing support in a safe, stigma-free and non-clinical environment, without the need for an appointment or referral; recognises that the service will be available to members of the public seven days a week; believes that this will help to reduce pressure on statutory services by offering early intervention and preventative support, with the aim of supporting people before their mental health worsens; notes that this is SAMH's second Nook facility and that it will provide a range of support, including information and resources, talking therapies, wellbeing activities, self-help sessions, events and opportunities for social connection; understands that The Nook will deliver a dedicated outreach programme for communities in Aberdeen and beyond; further understands that it will work with partners, from local support groups to national charities, to ensure that joined-up support is available; recognises what it sees as the vital work that SAMH has delivered in the north east of Scotland for many years, including through its supported accommodation service, work to prevent suicide and its provision of mental health link workers to Aberdeen GPs, and wishes all staff and volunteers at The Nook in Aberdeen all the best going forward.

***[S7M-00411](#) David Smith: Nursery Times by the River in Clydebank Recognised as One of Scotland's Top Nurseries**—That the Parliament congratulates Nursery Times by the River in Clydebank on being named among the top 20 nurseries in Scotland in the Nursery Awards 2026; understands that the recognition was awarded from among hundreds of nurseries across the country and was based on feedback from parents, carers and families whose children attend the setting; recognises the nursery's commitment to providing a safe, supportive and nurturing environment in which children can learn, develop and thrive; further recognises the dedication of staff in delivering high standards of early years' education and care; believes that the award reflects positive experiences reported by families and the trust placed in the nursery by the community; understands that the assessment considered a range of factors, including quality of care, learning and development, facilities, safeguarding and management, and wishes all children, staff and families associated with Nursery Times by the River continued success for the future.

***[S7M-00409](#) Fulton MacGregor: Potential Closure of the Time Capsule Ice Rink**—That the Parliament notes with concern reports that North Lanarkshire Council is being asked to approve proposals to redevelop the ice rink at the Time Capsule leisure centre in Coatbridge into a play and activity zone; recognises what it sees as the significant public opposition to the proposal, including the local authority's own engagement exercise, in which 78% of respondents expressed a desire to retain the rink; acknowledges the vital role that it believes the facility plays in supporting physical activity, health and wellbeing, community participation and social inclusion across Coatbridge and the wider North Lanarkshire area; notes the contribution that the rink reportedly makes to local ice sports, including figure skating, ice hockey and inclusive skating programmes, providing opportunities for people of all ages and abilities to participate in sport and develop confidence, skills and lifelong friendships; recognises testimony from users, families and community groups regarding the positive and often life-changing impact that the facility has had, particularly for young people and those from more marginalised backgrounds, including disabled people and/or people with additional needs; notes that a range of soft play and children's activity facilities already exist within Coatbridge, including a well-used soft play provision at the Time Capsule itself, whereas the ice rink represents a unique sporting facility that cannot easily be replicated elsewhere in the area; believes that the loss of the rink would remove a unique sporting and community asset from the area and limit access to ice sports for future generations, and calls on North Lanarkshire Council to reconsider the proposal, engage meaningfully with stakeholders and explore all available options to secure the long-term future of the Time Capsule ice rink as a valued community facility.

***[S7M-00408](#) Zen Ghani: Congratulations to Derek Reid BEM on Recognition in The King's Birthday Honours**—That the Parliament congratulates Derek Reid BEM of Castlemilk, Glasgow, on being recognised in The King's Birthday Honours List for his services to mental health and community wellbeing; acknowledges that Derek founded LD Let's Talk, which is a suicide awareness campaign that provides round-the-clock support to people experiencing crisis and has helped save lives across Glasgow and beyond; commends his commitment to promoting early intervention and positive conversations around mental health through the provision of talking benches in schools across the city; recognises his dedication to young people through running a football academy that supports more than 100 children; notes that he carries out this extensive community work alongside full-time employment and family commitments; acknowledges the profound impact that his compassion, leadership and tireless service have had in one of Glasgow's most deprived communities; welcomes the national recognition of his achievements through the award of the BEM, and thanks Derek for his continued efforts to ensure that no one faces their darkest moments alone.

***[S7M-00406](#) Liam McArthur: Scotland to Host Inaugural Global Agritourism Conference** —That the Parliament recognises that Scotland is set to host the first Global Agritourism Conference from 23 to 25 June 2026 at the P&J Live in Aberdeen; notes that, in 2021, Scotland launched the National Agritourism Strategy 2030, which is aimed at sustainably developing the industry, capturing accurate sector data and drawing attention to the important role that agritourism plays in the country, particularly in rural communities; considers this to be an opportunity for Scotland to showcase its thriving agritourism industry on a global stage, including 888 farms, crofts and estates offering farm accommodation and retail, tourism activities and events; notes that over 500 delegates representing 55 countries are expected to be in attendance; understands that attendees will have the opportunity to tour farms in Aberdeenshire, Angus and Moray that are involved in agritourism during the pre- and post-conference learning programme; pays tribute to the many businesses, farms and organisers, as well as Scottish Agritourism, for their work to make this conference possible, and wishes them all the best for a successful inaugural event.
