### Other new and altered motions and amendments

**\*[S7M-00514](#) Bob Doris: Scotland's Refugee World Cup**—That the Parliament commends the efforts of all those who organised, supported and participated in the Refugee World Cup, which was held in Glasgow on 21 June 2026; notes that the seven-a-side event, which began in 2012 as the Refugee Football Festival, has grown to become a key fixture in Scotland's community sports calendar and, this year, brought together teams of refugees, asylum seekers, migrants and local players from over 50 countries in a celebration of football and community; understands that the event was organised by Glasgow Afghan United, involved more than 250 players at Toryglen Regional Football Centre and included a women's competition for the first time; congratulates Wheatley Group on winning the Equality Cup, the Motherwell ('Well) Foundation on winning the Unity Cup, Cathkin Blazes on winning the Women's Cup and Glasgow Afghan United on being crowned Refugee World Cup winners 2026; believes that such events demonstrate the power of football to promote diversity and inclusion, and hopes that all those involved are equally enjoying the 2026 FIFA World Cup, irrespective of which countries they support.

**\*[S7M-00513](#) Clare Haughey: Reverend John Sanderson is Awarded Rotary International's Paul Harris Fellowship Award**—That the Parliament congratulates Rev John Sanderson, a community minister based at Rutherglen United Reform Church, on being presented with the Paul Harris Fellowship Award by the Rotary Club of Rutherglen; understands that the fellowship is one of the highest honours bestowed by Rotary International and was established in 1957 to recognise individuals who embody its motto, "Service Above Self"; notes that it is awarded to Rotarians and others who make a significant contribution to their communities; commends the strong partnership between Rutherglen URC and the Rotary Club of Rutherglen, and their shared work for the benefit of the people of Rutherglen and the wider community, and wishes John, and the incoming Rotary Club of Rutherglen president, Jan Dobson, all the best for their future endeavours.

**\*[S7M-00512](#) Donald MacKinnon: Celebrating Point and Sandwick Trust Renewable Energy Agreement** —That the Parliament congratulates Point and Sandwick Trust (PST) in Lewis on securing a landmark renewable energy agreement with Navantia UK; understands that the agreement will see the UK's largest community-owned wind farm, Beinn Ghrideag, supply the majority of the renewable electricity required by Navantia UK's shipbuilding and fabrication facilities, including those at Arnish in Lewis, Methil in Fife and Appledore in North Devon; recognises that Beinn Ghrideag generates more than 20 gigawatt hours of clean electricity annually, with around one third of its output

meeting Navantia UK's energy needs; commends PST for demonstrating how community-owned renewable energy projects can compete successfully in national energy markets while delivering substantial environmental and economic benefits; recognises that all profits generated by the wind farm are reinvested in local communities, supporting employment, education, environmental initiatives, community facilities and measures to tackle fuel poverty; believes that this partnership showcases the vital role of community-owned renewable energy in supporting economic development in island communities, advancing the transition to net zero and delivering lasting local benefits; notes the importance of the Arnish yard as a major source of skilled employment, and welcomes the role played by the UK Government in helping to secure the future of the yard through facilitating its commercial acquisition by Navantia UK, safeguarding around 150 skilled jobs on Lewis.

\*[S7M-00511](#) **Jenni Minto: Carr Gomm Responder Service**—That the Parliament congratulates Carr Gomm on receiving well-deserved recognition for its responder service at the European Social Services Conference in Malta; notes that the social care charity was invited to contribute to the "Community Care in Action: Innovative Approaches from Across Europe" session, where it shared its knowledge and expertise on the service's effectiveness in supporting people to live safely and well in their own homes, reducing unnecessary hospital admissions and building trust with individuals, families and public services; recognises the important work undertaken by Carr Gomm to deliver responsive, person-centred support in a uniquely rural setting, and commends all staff involved in its responder and care at home services in Argyll and Bute for their hard work and dedication, which have led to this recognition.

\*[S7M-00509](#) **Q Manivannan: Celebrating Village and Town Halls**—That the Parliament celebrates the contribution of village and town halls to community cultural life across Scotland; recognises that such halls are often run by small groups of volunteers, who play an essential role in facilitating local concerts, ceilidhs and storytelling events, including those held at Abriachan Village Hall, Galashiels Volunteer Hall, Letham Village Hall, Portobello Town Hall, Newhaven Community Church hall and the LifeCare Centre in Stockbridge; recognises what it sees as the immense efforts of volunteers in creating and sustaining vibrant and welcoming community spaces; believes that village and town halls are vital to strengthening social cohesion and promoting arts and culture, and further believes that such facilities should be appropriately supported to enable them to continue delivering social, cultural and wellbeing benefits to the communities that they serve.

As soon as a Public Bill (i.e. a Government, Committee or Member's Bill) has completed Stage 1, amendments for consideration at Stage 2 may be lodged; and as soon as Stage 2 is completed, amendments for Stage 3 consideration may be lodged. The last lodging day for amendments at Stage 2 is four sitting days before the meeting at which those amendments will be considered (e.g. Wednesday for a meeting on Tuesday); at Stage 3 it is five days before. Amendments may be lodged until 2.30 pm on any sitting day, except on the last lodging day for each Stage, when the deadline is 12 noon.

A Hybrid Bill is subject to the same rules except in the case of Stage 2 where amendments for consideration may be lodged no earlier than the completion of any consideration of evidence at Stage 2.

Amendments to Private Bills are subject to different deadlines. These are set out in Rule 9A.12 of Standing Orders.

Members are advised to lodge amendments in good time before the beginning of a Stage and as early as possible during the day.
