Culture, Tourism, Europe and External Affairs Committee call for views Census (Amendment) (Scotland) Bill

Introduction

The Culture, Tourism, Europe and External Affairs Committee has been designated as the lead Committee scrutinising the Census (Amendment) (Scotland) Bill. This call for evidence seeks views on the proposals in the Bill.

Background

The Census (Amendment) (Scotland) Bill was introduced in the Scottish Parliament on 2 October 2018. The primary purpose of the Bill is to make answering census questions about aspects of gender identity, and about sexual orientation, voluntary. The Bill also adds references to "gender identity" and to "sexual orientation" to the schedule of matters which may be required to be given in a census. Full details of the Bill can be accessed at:

Remit for the Call for Evidence

The Committee seeks views on the proposals contained in the Census (Amendment) (Scotland) Bill including the proposed power in the Bill to provide for questions dealing with "gender identity" and "sexual orientation" to be included in the Census for the first time.

The Committee will begin to take evidence at Stage One of the Bill towards the end of 2018.
