Interests

The Convener (Bob Doris): Good morning, everyone, and welcome to the first meeting of the Public Service Reform Committee.

Michelle Campbell (Renfrewshire North and Cardonald) (SNP): I draw members' attention to my interests. I am a nurse, and I work for NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde in a casual capacity, just to maintain my registration. Also, I have a dual mandate: I am a councillor on Renfrewshire Council.

Max Bannerman (Highlands and Islands) (Reform): I have no registrable interests to declare.

Joe Fagan (South Scotland) (Lab): I am a councillor on South Lanarkshire Council.

Murdo Fraser (Mid Scotland and Fife) (Con): I am a member of the Law Society of Scotland, although I am not currently practising. Beyond that, I do not believe that I have other registrable interests relevant to the committee.

Alex Kerr (Hamilton, Larkhall and Stonehouse) (SNP): I am a councillor on Glasgow City Council.

Lorna Slater (Edinburgh Central) (Green): I draw members' attention to the "Voluntary" section of my entry in the register of interests: my husband works for Heriot-Watt University, and I am the chair of the friends of Holyrood park, which is a local community group. That is a voluntary position, although the group may apply for some grant funding from time to time.
