Dog Theft (Scotland) Bill

Introduction

- 1. The <u>Dog Theft (Scotland) Bill</u> was introduced by Maurice Golden MSP on 17 February 2025.
- The purpose of the Bill is to make dog theft a statutory offence. The Bill also includes other provisions relating to dog theft and the proposed offence. Further information about the Bill's provisions can be found in the <u>Dog Theft (Scotland)</u> <u>Bill Briefing</u> published by SPICe.
- 3. Information about the member's bill proposal, including a summary of the responses to the consultation on the draft bill proposal, can be found on the Parliament's web pages
- 4. The Committee took evidence from relevant stakeholder organisations at its meeting on 26 March. In addition, some stakeholders have provided written comments and these are published on the Bill's web pages.

The <u>Scottish Government set out its views on the bill in a memorandum</u> and the Committee then took <u>evidence from the Minister for Victims and Community</u> <u>Safety on 23 April 2025</u>. The <u>Minister provided further information on a number</u> <u>of points in a letter on 15 May 2025</u>.
