Schools (Residential Outdoor Education) (Scotland) Bill

Introduction

- 1. Liz Smith MSP introduced the <u>Schools (Residential Outdoor Education)</u>
 <u>(Scotland) Bill</u> on 20 June 2024. The Education, Children and Young People's Committee has been designated as the lead committee for this Members' Bill at Stage 1.
- 2. The Bill establishes that all pupils in state and grant-aided schools will have the chance to experience at least four nights and five days of residential outdoor education during their school career.

Committee meeting

- 3. At this meeting, the Committee receive an update on issues related to the Bill from the following witnesses—
 - Minister for Children, Young People and the Promise;
 - Lewis Hedge, Deputy Director, Curriculum & Qualifications, Scottish Government;
 - Saskia Kearns, Team Leader, Learning for Sustainability and Outdoor Learning, Scottish Government; and
 - Kirstie McKerron, Scottish Government Legal Directorate.

Timescales

Stage 1

- 4. The Committee considered the Bill at Stage 1 and <u>published its report</u> on 4 February 2025, agreeing with the general principles of the Bill on a casting vote. The <u>Scottish Government responded</u> to the report on 26 March 2025.
- 5. The <u>Stage 1 debate</u> took place on 27 March 2025 and the Parliament agreed to the general principles of the Bill following a division (64 for, 1 against, 53 abstained, 10 did not vote).

Financial Resolution

6. As this Bill contains particular provisions affecting payments from the Scottish Consolidated Fund, no proceedings can be taken on the Bill after Stage 1 unless

the Parliament has, by resolution, agreed to the relevant provisions. That resolution is known as a "Financial Resolution".

- 7. Only a member of the Scottish Government or a junior Scottish Minister can lodge a motion for a Financial Resolution and so the Scottish Government has a veto on whether any Bill that requires such a resolution makes progress.
- 8. Unless a motion is lodged within six months of the completion of Stage 1 i.e by 27 September 2025, and the Parliament agrees to it, this Bill will fall.

Correspondence

- 9. The Minister <u>wrote to the Committee</u> on 5 May 2025, setting out the key conditions that would have to be met, before there could be consideration on whether or not to lodge a Financial Resolution.
- 10. In addition, following the Stage 1 debate, Liz Smith MSP wrote to the Minister (copied to the Committee) on <u>a number of occasions</u> regarding ongoing discussions on various aspects of the Bill including a Financial Resolution and wrote most recently on <u>12 August 2025</u>.
