Cross-Party Group Applications

Introduction

1. In accordance with the provisions on Cross-Party Groups (CPGs) set out in section 6 of the Code of Conduct (the Code), proposals for the establishment of CPGs in the Scottish Parliament must be submitted to the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee (the Committee) for its approval.
2. There are four proposed Groups for the Committee's consideration.

Proposed CPG on Creative Economy

3. The registration form submitted by the proposed Group is attached at Annexe A to this note.

Consideration by the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee

4. Paragraph 18 of Section 6 of the Code states "...one of the proposed Group's MSP office bearers (usually the Convener) will be invited to attend a meeting of the Committee to explain the justification for the proposed Group." Claire Baker MSP has been invited to the meeting to discuss registration of the proposed Group.

Purpose

5. Paragraph 19 Section 6 of the Code states "the Committee will pay particular attention to a proposed Group's purpose. If the Committee considers that a proposed Group is not in the public interest but is intended, for example, to further particular commercial interests, the Group will not be accorded recognition. The Committee will also consider whether the purpose of a proposed Group overlaps the remit of an existing Group. If there is any overlap Groups are asked to provide justification as to why their aims could not effectively be achieved within an existing Group".
6. The stated purpose of the proposed Group is—
 - The purpose of the group is to exchange ideas and learning around the development and support of the future creative economy.

- The group will consider support for creative economy in Scotland, exploring barriers to success and highlighting any potential solutions.

7. Although there is now a CPG on Culture and Communities, which was approved by the Committee at the meeting on 28 October, the Group does not consider its purpose overlaps with any other existing Group. The form states that—

- “The Creative Economy Group will focus on for example industrial support, entrepreneurship, economics, investment, private sector, international working. Whereas the Cross-Party Group on Culture and Communities will focus on the impact of the public sector, for example the social, health and educational impact of access and participation in the arts, heritage, libraries, and museums.”

Membership

8. Paragraph 8 of Section 6 of the Code requires group membership to include at least five MSPs, with at least one MSP from each of the parties or groups represented on the Parliamentary Bureau. The Committee has previously agreed that there should be a general waiver of this Rule in the current Session and Groups are now required to have five MSPs from the majority of parties represented on the Parliamentary Bureau. The proposed Group meets this requirement.

9. The MSP membership (by party) of the proposed Group is as follows—

- One Scottish Conservative and Unionist Party
- Five Scottish Labour Party
- One Scottish Liberal Democrat Party
- Two Scottish National Party

10. Paragraph 9 of Section 6 of the Code entitles groups to contain members from outwith the Parliament. The proposed Group has listed 19 non-MSP members in the individual category and 29 in non-MSP member organisations.

Office Bearers

11. Paragraph 10 of Section 6 of the Code requires one MSP to be Convener of the Group and there to be at least one other MSP office bearer. The proposed Group meets this requirement: Claire Baker MSP is the Convener of the Group and Jenni Minto MSP is the Deputy-Convener.

Financial Benefits and Subscription

12. The registration form indicates that—

- “Culture Counts (secretariat) is a project hosted by the Federation of Scottish Theatre. The project receives funding from Creative Scotland and

from membership subscriptions from members across culture and creative industries, to undertake the work of the Culture Counts project.

- Funding allocated to Culture Counts which will be assigned to this Cross-Party Group in 2021/22 is approximately £1495.00. This includes staff time, artists fees, speakers' fees, room hire and refreshments.”

13. The registration form also indicates that members will not be charged a subscription.

Proposed CPG on India

14. The registration form submitted by the proposed Group is attached at Annexe B to this note.

Consideration by the Standards, Procedures and Public Appointments Committee

15. Pam Gosal MSP has been invited to the meeting to discuss registration of the proposed Group.

16. The Group did not provide the required meeting notification, this was due to the Convener and her staff being new to the Parliament. The rules that Groups are required to comply with have been notified to the Group and will be re-iterated if the Group is accorded recognition.

17. The stated purpose of the proposed Group is—

- The Cross-Party Group on India seeks to promote relations between Scotland and India. The Group seeks to work with organisations and authorities to increase cultural, educational and economic exchange between the two countries, who could be one of our largest trading partners which will help support our economy, to engage with the Consulate General of India in Edinburgh and other interested organisations. The group will act as a platform for relevant stakeholders to share their experience and expertise and further aims to find a platform for discussion with MSPs and to keep them informed of the issues raised.

18. The Group does not consider its purpose overlaps with any other existing Group.

Please state the purpose of the Group.</p> <p>To promote understanding of the complexities of the social work profession, bring together its voice and positively raise its profile.</p> <p>2. Please also provide a brief explanation of the purpose of the Group and why the purpose is in the public interest.</p> <p>The social work profession is a single profession, very connected to, but separate from, social care. Social workers hold specific duties for welfare and have statutory powers to intervene where necessary. The governance of social work is spread across local authorities, the independent sector and health and social care partnerships. It can be challenging to bring these diverse experiences and voices together, to support and influence national policy and legislation. There can be a lack of, or stereotypical public understanding of the profession, often negatively perpetuated by the media. This CPG will provide a space to collaboratively address issues and work towards solutions in the profession, for people who use social work services, their families, and communities - and for social workers themselves. It will also seek to raise awareness of the profession and to raise its profile in a positive way, to better enable the public to understand the key role that social workers' play in people's lives. This becomes even more significant as Scotland moves towards establishing a National Care Service, of which social work will play an integral part.</p> <p>3. Please also provide details of any overlaps with the purpose of existing Cross-Party Groups and an explanation of why, regardless of any such overlap, the Group should be established.</p> <p>Social workers work across adults, children, and justice services and, of course, many of the individuals and families they work with have needs that cut across all these specialisms. There are connections with the CPG on disability and on learning disability and the CPG on carers, given social workers support and protect individuals and families from within these groups. However, these groups are unlikely to explore the social work role in these contexts and whilst there are relevant links, they are not 'overlaps' in purpose, per se. The CPG on social work is the first of its kind since the establishment of the Scottish Parliament.</p>
