Introduction

- 1. This is a continued petition that was last considered by the Committee at its meeting on <u>1 September 2021</u>.
- 2. At that meeting, the Committee discussed the Scottish Government submission of <u>8 June 2021</u> whereby the Scottish Government explained that the requirements for the appointments to a public body board are set out in the public body's founding legislation.
- 3. The Committee highlighted that there was "nothing in the Scottish Government's submission to suggest that it has any plans to amend founding legislation for public

bodies on the basis that lifeline services to island communities require community representation on their boards".

- 4. The Committee therefore agreed to write to the Scottish Government to clarify whether it had any plans to amend founding legislation for public bodies which provide lifeline services to island communities, to require community representation on their boards.
- 5. To date no response from the Scottish Government has been received.
